35 vaccination teams from the Ministry of Health were mobilized today to pre-schools and primary schools in the Vaimauga District to start the vaccination drive to protect children age

5 to 11 years old from COVID-19. And Prime Minister Fiamē Naomi Mataafa was on site at four of the schools, Tanugamanono Primary, Vaivase-tai Primary, Vailele Primary School and the Samoa Primary (Private) School at Vailele as well.

The Prime Minister over the weekend had announced the start of the vaccination drive for the young children from Fa'aala Savai'i over the weekend after launching the Pathway for the Development of Samoa 2021-2026 in Salelologa.

Govt. to re-evaluate the RSE Programs

Flaws in the local processing of job applications for seasonal employment overseas is a concern to Government. Residents with full time jobs in the public and private sectors are working overseas as Seasonal workers even though the jobs are explicitly earmarked for the unemployed.

Then there are the latest allegations of ill-treatment of Samoan seasonal workers surfacing overseas in particular in Australia which is an unnecessary thorn to the Government and

undermines the framework and processes in place to handle and resolve these differences on the Government to Government level and not on social media platforms, says Prime Minister Fiamē Naomi Mataafa in response to Savali inquiries concerning the latest developments pertaining to the RSE Seasonal Employment saga.

“There is no question that paramount to the Government is the safety of our Samoan citizens working overseas as seasonal workers,” she reassured. “And Government will not hesitate to address and response to any incident of mistreatment of Samoan citizens.”

However she noted that in the case of the recent incidents in Australia, she advices Samoas diaspora residing in Down Under to respect the government protocols which are there for the best interest of Samoan citizens including seasonal workers.

She urged the Samoan diaspora that there are Government representatives in New Zealand and Australia looking into the issues raised by the seasonal workers; adding the seasonal worker scheme was initiated after lengthy and detailed dialogues between Government's and so when issues arise it's

Women Leaders Media Masterclass & Samoa's Prime Minister

"These are trying times for our nations and peoples. The challenges are testing the very mettle of our nations and governments beyond any limits that we have known in our lifetime," says Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa in her presentation to the Women Leaders Media Master class Zoom Conference organized by the Pacific Media Assistance Scheme, (PAC-MAS).

As the main presenter, Samoa's Government leader remains firm on her resolve that despite the trying times the Pacific is at crossroads due to the global pandemic of epic proportions and a climate crisis where the Region remain at the frontline, "the Pacific are a resilient people."

PATHWAY FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF SAMOA

The Zoom Conference also provided the opportunity for the first Woman Prime Minister of Samoa to eloquently touch on her Government's vision and aspirations for the next five years as articulated by the Pathway for the Development of Samoa 2022-2026 launched last week.

"My government has prioritized strengthened engagement and support to the communities as we face these challenging times," elaborated the Prime Minister one of the longest serving Parliamentarians in Samoa's history and still in office.

"Increased committed to taking a human rights approach to implementing our Sustainable Development Goals, focusing investment in people, especially the vulnerable groups and strengthening social protection to name a few."

"The new Government, under my leadership, is pursuing a vision of "Fostering social harmony, safety and freedom for all", she continued. "It is

critical to ensure that we empower communities, share prosperity for all and build resilience."

SAMOA'S JOURNEY

For the country the Prime Minister noted that Samoa has recently come through a period of political instability and uncertainty, eased only through the strength of her Christian values and principles; our Constitution, democratic traditions, and an independent judiciary upholding the Rule of Law.

"Samoa will celebrate its 60th anniversary in 2022 since gaining Independence," she added. "Our long journey has been thwarted with the treats of pandemics, natural disasters, climate change and more recently a constitutional crisis following our 2021 general elections. Our ability to recover from devastating natural disasters, to learn from tragic epidemics and to survive a political crisis, is testament to our resilience, strong culture, and functioning democratic processes."

THE PACIFIC WAY

As a region, Samoa's Prime Minister is adamant that continuing to treat the Pacific simply as 'ever needy yet compliant' recipients belies the necessary and critical contribution, which the region have to make to a world view which are formed by our histories and cultures and plainly 'because we live here'.

The Pacific views, she says will enrich and enhance the quality of the discussion as well as the decision-making.

"I am convinced that the key to Pacific survival is through the unity of all its parts. United we can remain resilient. While the focus in addressing challenges nationally or regionally seems to be on governments, we must do better in recognizing and utilizing the key role NGO, private sector and the media play," recommended Fiame.

WOMEN LEADERSHIP IN THE PA-

CIFIC

As for Women Leadership in the region, the Prime Minister believes that in the past decade tremendous strides have been made evidenced by the range of legislations and programmes to improve this record. However she feels that it is also important the Pacific to also recognize that women's leadership doesn't equal just parliamentarians and high chiefs.

"It is also the aualuma or untitled women that are instrumental in organizing, community projects and other public interest activities, the innovative women farmers or entrepreneurs supporting their families, or the church Minister's wives that brings unity to the community or gives counsel to the troubled youth," she noted. With the same token, Fiame feels that while much needs to improve still in terms of more women in leadership roles, she believes that "we must also be confident to recognize women leadership roles within our own specific context that have huge positive impacts within our own societies."

ROLE OF THE MEDIA

She also acknowledges the role of the free press noting that "Journalism plays a huge role in our society today."

"Today the news business is faster, more pressurized, and infinitely more complex. But the core values of accuracy, independence and responsible reporting - which have evolved over the years - remain as relevant as ever, even in these digital times."

Launch AgriTouch App

The Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries (MAF) in partnership with the UNDP, UNESCO and the Indian High Commission to New Zealand has officially launched Samoa's very own AgriTouch Application for Smartphones Monday 7 March at the Taumeasina Island Resort.

The event was attended by special guests; United Nations Resident Coordinator, Simona Marinescu, Indian Consul to Samoa Va'atu 'itu'i, Apete Meredith and Director UNESCO Pacific, Ms Nisha as well as local farmers and Ministry staff.

AgriTouch is a product of the Ministry under the Samoa Knowledge Society Initiative (SKSI); a joint programme of the United Nations under its agencies (UNDP and UNESCO) funded by the Indian-UN Development Partnership Fund.

The functions of AgriTouch App aim to address knowledge gaps identified by farmers in consultations with MAF and SKSI partners in July and October 2021 by providing up to date information focused on markets, crop management, and current projects co-ordinated by the Ministry, funding opportunities as well as a tool to track production and expenses for farmers.

In his opening remarks the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, Hon. Laualiale-malietao Polataivao Fossie Schmidt said the development of the App is a significant achievement in laying the foundation for MAF to promote knowledge-based sharing to support sustainable development of agriculture. He also hailed the event as a local success story demonstrating the young Samoan tech talent driving the digital agricultural innovation in Samoa.

"Today we now wish to share with you the App designed and named by our very own farmers as "AgriTouch" said Minister Laauli. "While designed by our very own farmers, it was built by Ms Tooa Brown of Brown Consult, an innovative young Samoan woman who is currently working for our Ministry. Therefore, we can be proud to say that it is 100% made in Samoa!"

"This partnership and support from our donors have now allowed us to reach this monumental stage of having the first-ever App developed by our Ministry in collaboration with our farmers. We acknowledge that while we are now taking a step in the digital direction, we still have a long way to go to ensure that AgriTouch becomes sustainable in its use. This will be achieved if the users continue to provide the feedback needed so that our Ministry can continue to adapt it to suit the needs of the users - our farmers."

The Hon. Minister also acknowledged and thanked the Ministry's partners involved in making the AgriTouch application possible for Samoa's farmers,

"I wish to acknowledge the funding through the Indian-UN Development Partnership Fund which paid for all the workshops for our farmers as well as the consultant and our new graduates from the University of the South Pacific studying in the Agriculture Programme."

"These students together with the consultant collected the information and carried out field visits to develop and adapt the AgriTouch App allowing us to now reach the stage where we can launch it. We also wish to acknowledge the support of our other donor agencies such as the International Fund for Agriculture Development for their support through our Deliverology Associates which allowed for additional time for our Consultant to focus on the completion of the Agritouch."

Due to travel restrictions, His Excellency Muktesh K. Pardeshi, Indian High Commissioner to Samoa was unable to make the event but his remarks were delivered by CEO Tilafono David Hunter on his behalf,

"The initiative was developed in the belief that access to information and knowledge represents for building inclusive knowledge societies. Information not only empowers people to make decisions but also allows them to exercise their rights, be economically active and learn new skills," writes HE Muktesh.

"The AgriTouch app is an efficient tool for farmers; this will go a long way to strengthen the partnership between government and farmers. Congratulations for the excellent work done on the development of the App which will ensure access to a treasure of information for the farmers."

"The Government of India through the SKSI looks to contribute towards Samoa's vision of placing itself as a knowledge hub in the region to help in developing its E-Governments, E-Education and E-Health services. India is a partner and true friend and would like to extend a helping hand to Samoa towards its social economic development"

To close the event, Smart App developer, Ms Tooa Brown gave a presentation on the AgriTouch App demonstrating how the different functions supports farmers with information and knowledge about farming methods, business operations and funding opportunities. The AgriTouch is a free App available on Google Play and Apple Store.

MoH's vaccine refrigeration woes

(EDITOR'S NOTE- The Public Service Commission have been called in to investigate the circumstances leading up to refrigeration incident at the Ministry of Health which destroyed over 3,000 Pfizer vaccinations. In announcing the Cabinet Directive, Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa this is a normal procedure articulated by the 2004 PSC Act. She also reminds public servants that the same Act also hold each one responsible for the actions their job performance. The article below covers the internal communication in the aftermath of the problems with the MoH's refrigerator.)

One of the three compressors that backs up the cooler at the pharmaceutical warehouse, which houses all vaccines "was turned off by someone" at the hospital, so when the malfunction occurred to the refrigerator, it was completely shut off as the back compressor did not kick in automatically.

This led to the damaging of the more than 3,000 Pfizer vaccinations.

This was revealed in a letter by the Kooline refrigeration Samoa Limited to the Ministry of Health dated 25 of February, 2022 and was accompanied by the Incident Report prepared by Dr Robertson Thomsen the ACEO for the Ministry of Health.

Obtained by Radio Polynesia, Dr Thomsen's report indicated that at 10am on 14 of February, it was reported there was a fridge cooling fault to the main storage walk-in cooler at the pharmaceutical warehouse.

The MOH team and Kooline managed to operate the standby compressor which brought the temperature back down to less than 8 degree Celsius, the right temperature to store the Pfizer vaccines.

The temperature logger is set up to be monitored remotely via Bluetooth and WiFi to enable any changes to be monitored and detected using a cell phone by accessing the supply website dashboard.

The report says on the night in question, the automated temperature logger inside the fridge started to detect a gradual rise in temperature above 8 degree Celsius and the breach is be-

lieved to be caused by sudden fluctuation with the main power supply to the warehouse.

This caused "the primary compressor to malfunction" which led to the failure of the primary compressor to properly shutdown in order for the 2back up compressor to start."

Furthermore it also caused failure to the internal temperature sensors to link and synchronize to the Bluetooth tablet.

The report says the AztraZeneca was not affected but 3,240 Pfizer vaccines were affected by the temperature breach and as per agreement with the New Zealand Government, they had to report it.

Seiuli Timothy Betham of Kooline in his letter noted in his letter there are three compressors and two that are operational with a third one placed as back up and it's set up that when one fails the other automatically activates. However, their investigation uncovered the second compressor was manually turned off.

Furthermore, Seiuli urged the Ministry of Health that a monthly inspection of the cooler at the pharmaceutical warehouse should be conducted on a monthly basis.

Dr Thomsen in his report also made recommendations for Cabinet's consideration to have inspections once every two months for maintenance and repairs; also to expedite construction and refurbishing of a New Vaccine Storage and Distribution facility and to procure and connect voltage stabilizers to protect equipment from power surge.

In her address, Fiame acknowledged the Government of New Zealand's generosity for the donation of 30,000 Pfizer vaccine doses for Samoa's children. And called on the parents, teachers and traditional leaders support to assist government and school officials with the program. Today's site visit by the Prime Minister, accompanied by Cabinet Ministers for Health Taifito Valasi Luapitofanua Toogamaga Taifito Selesele and Education Minister Seuala Ioane Tu'a'au is to bolster moral support for the health teams on the ground and reassure the country, that under the new Governments' watch, they will not leave anyone behind including the young children during these trying times as a result of COVID-19.

Like the vaccines for adults, the Pfizer vaccines for the 5 to 11 years old must be administered twice however for the young ones they need to complete the 2 injections in four weeks after their initial injections. Silimanai reappointed to lead Airport Authority as General Manager.

Silimanai Ueta Banse Jr. Solomon has been reappointed by Cabinet to continue as the new General Manager of the Samoa Airport Authority, (SAA) for another three years.

He brings close to 30 years of experience in the aviation industry including 12 years in management level posts with the SAA.

From 2012, Silimanai was SAA's Assistant General Manager for Operations and Aerodromes and tasked, amongst other duties and responsibilities, as the Aerodromes Specialist to complete project funding papers for the:

- terminal expansion with the Japanese International Cooperation Agency (JICA). This was later replaced with the Shanghai Construction Group terminal upgrade project.

- preliminary scoping and conduct of initial studies (Environment & Social Management Plans) of the World Bank-funded Samoa Aviation Investment Project (SAIP) to project approval in August 2014.

His initial training was conducted at the Singapore Aviation Academy com-

plemented by further trainings with the Civil Aviation Authority of Fiji Air Traffic Training College.

In March 2000, he secured a contract with the Fiji based Strategic Air Services Limited at their Nausori Airport Facility. Two years later Silimanai was transferred to Nadi.

He continued his studies to qualify as an Area/Oceanic Controller. Subsequent trainings were conducted

in several countries – New Zealand (Air Traffic Services Examiner and Risk Assessment and Mitigation), Korea (Air Navigation Policy), and Malaysia (Airport Economics).

The 45-year old Silimanai completed his primary, secondary and tertiary education in Suva, Fiji and is a graduate of the University of the South Pacific Foundation Program.

somewhat "sensitive matters".

She also urged Samoans fortunate to be hired as seasonal employees to follow the protocols in place when they encounter issues to address it with their representatives in those Country's to ensure the issues are resolved.

"Government is not letting these allegations fly by and we are looking into the real issues behind the issues," the Prime Minister reiterated.

As for the granting seasonal jobs to residents with full time jobs including public servants, Prime Minister Fiame says that clearly the seasonal employment objectives to award the jobs to the unemployed are exploited.

These incidents coupled by the astronomical increases in the number of Samoans hired as seasonal workers is more than enough reason for Government to re-evaluate the merits and benefits of the employment schemes.

As of this month, close to 3,000 Samoans are employed in Australia through the Pacific Labour Mobility Program which provides three year contracts complemented by Australia's Seasonal Employment platform which grants up to 7 months working opportunities in Down Under.

New Zealand's Recognised Seasonal Employees Scheme accounts for over 3,000 from 600 when Samoa joined the Pacific Seasonal Employment family in the early 1990's.

In a nutshell, after reviewing the latest issues the Prime Minister and Cabinet have come to the conclusion that in the interest and integrity of the seasonal employment scheme a re-evaluation is warranted.

Presently Cabinet has approved the trips till the end of March to transport seasonal worker abroad with the fate of future seasonal employment opportunities abroad in the hands of Prime Minister Fiame and her Cabinet.

JOINT STATEMENT – NAFANUA II

Samoa and Australia were saddened by the unfortunate grounding of Samoa's Guardian-class Patrol Boat, Nafanua II in August last year. Technical specialists from Australia were contracted to undertake the successful salvage operation, which had minimal environmental impact.

Following its arrival in Cairns, a thorough assessment of Nafanua II was undertaken. This assessment found the vessel to be beyond economical repair. Ownership of Nafanua II is being transferred from the Government of Samoa to the Australian Government as we look at options for disposal.

Australia remains a committed maritime security partner for Samoa, continuing to provide support to ensure the ongoing protection of Samoa's Exclusive Economic Zone, including through collaboration with regional partners. Australia is working closely with Samoa to address Samoa's maritime security needs. Australia is proud to partner with our Pacific family to enhance and coordinate continued maritime regional security.
