One of the new Governments' founding principal is to respect the rule of law at all costs.

Under the Fa'atuatua ile Atua Samoa Tutoatasi Political Party's flagship, the new Government leader and Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa did not make no qualms during a Press Conference to reinstate her Governments' resolve to respect and obey the rule of law.

In light of the issues between the Land and Titles Court President Fepulea'i Atilla Ropati and Justice Minister, Matamua Vasati Pulufana going south, Prime Minister Fiame told the press that under no circumstance should the issue be misinterpreted as intervention by the Executive Branch.

Instead, she says that in light of the many issues surrounding the three Land and Titles Court legislations approved by Parliament in 2020, her Justice Minister Matamua's position was made in the best interest of the Legislative and Judiciary Branches and ultimately fair justice for the public.

The Prime Minister pointed to the multiple versions of the approved House legislation signed by the Head of State which has been in circulation since it became law.

That matter is now scrutinized by a Parliamentary Commission of Inquiry approved by the House recently.

There are also associated legal issues that must be clarified, she says. For example, the Prime Minister ex-

Samoa's COVID-19 Alert Levels revamped

Be Prepared, (Scouts Motto) is the message between the lines in the revamped COVID-19 Alert levels approved by Cabinet and announced by Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa during a recent Press Conference.

The revision, according to the Prime Minister was prompted after the January 19th Repatriation Flight scare after imported Omicron Virus positive cases infiltrated the country.

Close to 30 Samoan passengers repatriated from Australia were tested positive not including five registered nurses who provided health care for the incoming passengers since the flight touched down at Faleolo International Airport.

The presence of Omicron Virus cases in double digits for the first time prompted Cabinet to adopt the Scouts Motto- Be Prepared and accordingly restructure Samoa's COVID-19 Alert Levels as follows;

- GREEN- Level zero (0) - when there is a pandemic around the world.
- YELLOW-Level one (1) - when there are imported positive cases and are in managed isolation.
- ORANGE -Level two (2) - when there are multiple cases or when the number of positive cases of

COVID-19 increases within the different isolation centers around the country.

- RED- Level (3) when there is a community transmission. Automatically the nationwide lockdown goes into effect.

Samoa has already encountered the Orange Alert Level 2 when 31 positive cases (26 passengers and 5 front line nurses) imported from the Australia January 19th flight was recorded, Prime Minister Fiame clarified.

Since then, more imported positive cases have surfaced from the last flight from New Zealand which arrived earlier this month.

By Sunday 15 positive cases were recorded since the flight arrived on March 6th, 2022.

All the cases including the frontliners on duty when the flight arrived and the rest of the 172 passengers are well and remain asymptomatic, according to the latest situational report from the National Emergency Operation Center, (N.E.O.C.)

To minimize any change of a community outbreak, the Prime Minister resounded the no nonsense mandate to isolate every individual passenger including front liners associated to any incoming flight with positive cases.

"There are positive cases from the recent New Zealand flight and everyone

including our frontliners have since been placed in managed isolation," said the Prime Minister.

Including frontline staff in the Isolation Protocol is made in the best interest of their families and loved ones as well as the entire country, reiterated Fiame reassuring the country that when it comes to the national security of the country, her Government will not entertain any unnecessary risks.

"Our frontline workers are in the high risk group because if they are infected, we cannot rule out the possibility of a community transmission outbreak," she explained.

She also echoed the public pleas from the N.E.O.C. and Ministry of Health encouraging residents to complete their Vaccination doses.

"We remind the public, especially those who have not done or completed their two shots of AstraZeneca, Pfizer, and booster shots to please do so.

Vaccination has proven to be a key component of concerted efforts to prevent hospitalization and death from COVID19," reads a Public Notice.

Samoa has so far evaded the wrath of the deadly virus with no hospitalization cases and God forbid no fatalities.

POST SCHOOL EDUCATION & TRAINING PROVIDERS AND STAKEHOLDERS CONSULTED ON THE DRAFT SQA AMENDMENT BILL 2022

The Samoa Qualifications Authority (SQA) will be consulting all Post School Education and Training (PSET) providers and all stakeholders including Government Ministries and Corporations, Private Sector Employers, Professional Associations, Development Partners as well as Regional and International Organisations on the Draft SQA Amendment Bill 2022.

The consultations will take place from Monday 14th to Wednesday 16th March, 2022 for Upolu Stakeholders and on Friday 18th March, 2022 only for Savaii Stakeholders.

SQA was established under the SQA Act 2006 which was repealed in 2010 to provide more regulatory functions to the Authority. As the SQA implements its regulatory and policy advisory functions, more measures were identified by the Authority to ensure the post school education and training sub sector continues to be strengthened to cater for the needs of students and to meet the expectations and needs

of workplaces.

It is also an opportune time to revisit the existing functions of the Authority to address areas for improvement taking into account lessons learned from years of implementation.

The main objective of the Consultation is for SQA to present the Draft SQA Amendment Bill 2022 for stakeholder feedback to enable finalisation for approval of the proposed Bill prior to its tabling for Parliament this year.

The SQA wishes to acknowledge the support of PSET Providers and all of its stakeholders for their continuous support over the years towards the implementation of SQA/PSET activities and for their valuable feedback in finalising the SQA Amendment Bill 2022.

TWO NEW POSITIVE CASES IN QUARANTINE

Two new positive cases have been identified in quarantine following follow up tests on close contacts of the health worker who tested positive on Friday, 11th March 2022.

These cases include a driver and a health worker.

Both were close contacts of the health worker who tested positive on Friday 11th March 2022.

They have been transferred to the isolation ward at Motootua, and they remain asymptomatic.

The number of positive cases has risen to 15 since the flight arrived on March 6th, 2022.

All are well and remain asymptomatic.

The public is encouraged to wear masks, practice social distancing, and wash hands regularly.

PUBLIC NOTICE

NOTICE TO ALL TAXPAYERS ON TAX INVOICE MONITORING SYSTEM (TIMS)

In support of Government's mandate in assisting the development of small sized businesses, Cabinet has now approved that TIMS will not apply to businesses with an annual turnover of less than SAT\$200, 000 tala.

There will be a new category of selected taxpayers below the SAT\$200, 000 threshold that will be monitored by the Ministry under a probationary period. This is to determine whether they will meet the threshold in the near future. Businesses determined by the Ministry to meet the threshold will be announced and shall be required to register for TIMS.

All taxpayers who were previously selected to register and comply with TIMS, and have been confirmed to exceed the SAT\$200,000 threshold, but have yet to complete registration are herein urged to ensure to fully comply with conditions and requirements by 1st July 2022 to fully comply. The Ministry will announce the full list of taxpayers required to comply with TIMS within the next week with registration details.

For all taxpayers who meet and exceed this set threshold and have already registered for TIMS, are required to fully comply by utilising TIMS in all their transactions, pursuant to all conditions.

Furthermore, those taxpayers who wish to voluntarily register are encouraged to contact our Ministry. plained that when the 2020 L.T.C. Act was approved into law amending the 1981 L.T.C. the appointment of L.T.C. judges was also amended.

“According to the 2020 L.T.C. Act the appointment of judges made under the 1981 L.T.C. Act was revoked,” attested Fiame. “There is no regulation in the 2020 Act to reappoint L.T.C. judges,” she told the Press.

These questionable issues had prompted Justice Minister Matamua to request the L.T.C. President to temporarily suspend the Lands and Titles Court proceedings until the outstanding legislative and legal matters are dealt with according to the rule of law, the Prime Minister continued.

“One of the issues on the Parliamentary Commission of Inquiry’s’ agenda is to request the suspension of LTC Court cases until further notice,” she added.

Overall the Prime Minister says that she is also concern that any decisions by L.T.C. now will have grounds to face civil actions by the public and it will be the Executive Branch held responsible to pay the civil claims and not the L.T.C.

“The end result will see taxpayers as collateral damage,” said Fiame.

There is also implications that the Executive Branch has cease the disbursement of public funds for the L.T.C. operations which the Prime Minister disputed noting that like the appointment of judges stipulated in the 2020 L.T.C. Act, nothing has changed.

This according to the leader of the Executive Branch is to allow the legislative process via the Parliamentary Commission of Inquiry to complete its mandate which should address the outstanding issues.

She says that under these circumstances Justice Minister Matamua cannot fulfill her legal obligations and responsibilities as a Minister of State until the issues are resolved.

Consequently before the Supreme Court are legal actions filed by the L.T.C. President naming the Justice Minister as one of the parties.

Out of respect for the rule of law, the Prime Minister like all of us awaits the outcome of these Court Proceedings.

Aiga Folau voyager once said : "Ou te tatalo, ia fa'asusuina i tatou, i le tāua o lenei iloa, o lenei tomai, o le folauga a tua'ā o aso anamua."

(My prayer is that we see the light of the importance of the voyaging knowledge and skills of our ancestors.)

"We must not forget our indigenous knowledge," Captain says. "It is our living traditional form of navigation. And it's all right here, on our Va'atele, Gaulofa."

"Voyaging is for anyone, for men, women, youth,"

Capt. Steffany explains. Gaulofa's first Samoan captain was a young woman, Fealofani.

He challenges youth to step up to be caretakers of Samoa's traditional knowledge and skills of navigation.

Aiga Folau hopes you will come and see Gaulofa and hear the voyagers' stories on Open Day.

Capt. Karl and others in the current crew have been sailing since their late twenties and early thirties but now hope to pass the knowledge on to the young people.

He admits, "I took on voyaging in 2010 at the age of 30, knowing nothing about sailing.

I came, I learnt, because I really wanted to know about folauga.

It's deep in my heart and soul. It's amazing - the knowledge our ancestors had."

SCATAP provide training to Vegetable Model Farmers

The Samoa China Agriculture Technical Aid Project (SCATAP) held a training course on Vegetable Model Farmer Orientation at the Demonstration Farm in Nu'u on Tuesday 8 March as part of the activities under Phase V of the Project.

To highlight the special co-operation between Samoa and China, the Hon. Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Chinese Ambassador were in attendance to officially open the training which was attended by local farmers, Crops Division personnel and the local media.

In his keynote speech the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, Hon. La'aulialemalietoa Leuatea Polataivao Fosi Schmidt stated that Agriculture is the backbone of Samoa's economy and going back to cultivate the land is one way to address the parallel challenges of hunger, poverty, COVID-19 pandemic and climate change.

"I encourage you all to take ownership of our agricultural initiatives...make use of these great opportunities and assistance by our Chinese agricultural experts, so that when the period of the project is over...we are still able to improve and sustain our farms by ourselves".

The People's Republic of China Ambassador to Samoa, H.E. Chao Xiaoliang offered his remarks stating that agriculture is fundamental for food, job, export and income in Samoa.

He said, "The Government of China will continue to provide assistance for the agricultural development in Samoa and Agriculture has become an important area of cooperation between Samoa and China".

One of the beneficiaries of this Project is Fuatino Moli from Faleasiu village, she shared her appreciation of the continued support from the government through SCATAP.

"This isn't my first time to receive support from this Project," said Mrs Moli.

"Of course there has been many challenges, especially with climate change but these new technologies including tunnel houses and irrigation has helped me and my family in sustaining our vegetable production to satisfy the local shops, restaurants and hotels we supply".

Another beneficiary, Hanna Forautonu, who raises livestock and supplies vegetables for local market also expressed her appreciation of the ongoing work of the SCATAP team.

"We have to be prepared and work hard on our farms, especially with the uncertainty of exports (vegetables and meat products) we have to work hard on making sure we have sufficient supply of vegetables and meat as substitute, and this is why we are so appreciative of this assistance from SCATAP" said Ms Forautonu.

According to SCATAP Team leader, Mr. Jim Liu, the Project will install 60 high-quality tunnel houses for 30 vegetable model farmers and provide farm tools and seeds to improve model farmers' vegetable production and increase income, the project will also establish 20 citrus model farms and 6 chicken model farms.

The orientation ended with distribution of some farm tools and seeds before a site visit around the SCATAP Demonstration Farm at Nu'u led by Mr. Liu with the assistance of his team and staff.

The main aim of the SCATAP Phase V is to strengthen agricultural extension, build agricultural facilities, provide agricultural machineries, and carry out agricultural training to increase the technical level of understanding and production capacity of vegetables, citrus and broiler farms in Samoa.

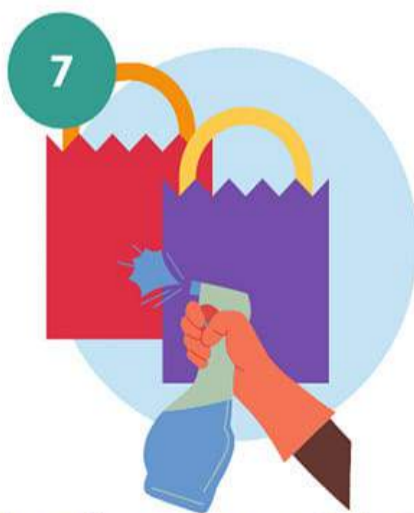

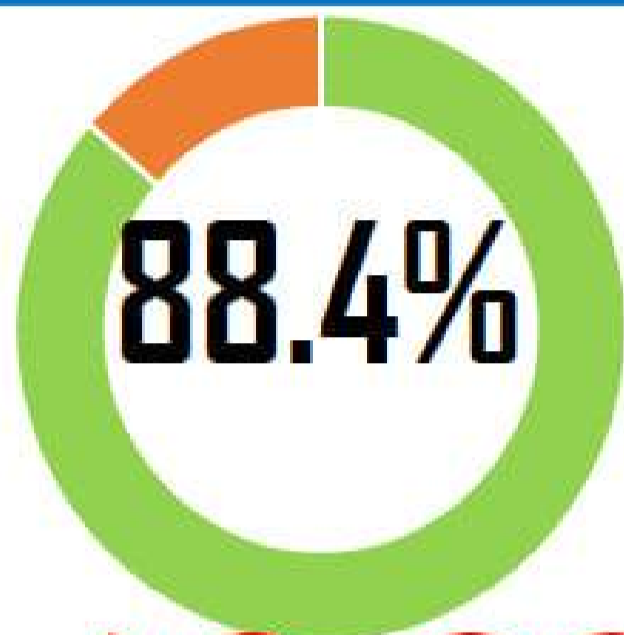

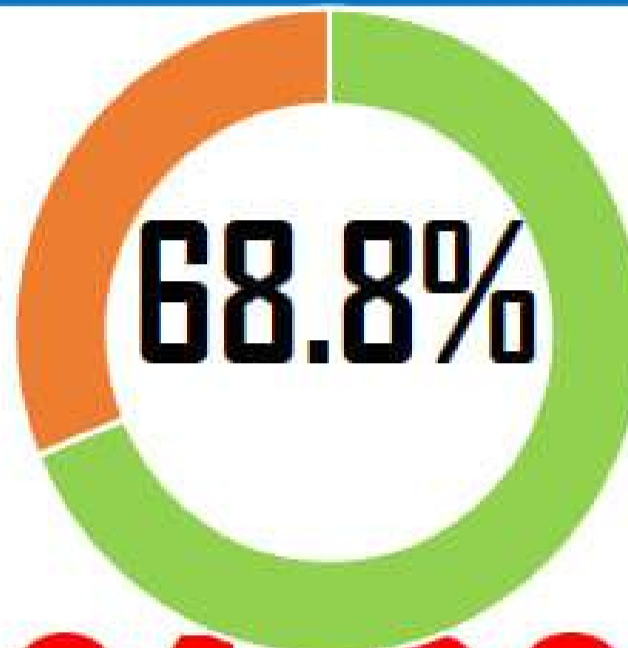


SAMOA VACCINATION OVERVIEW

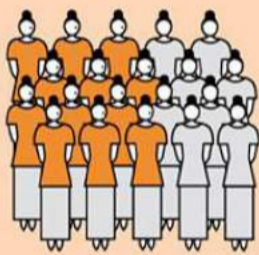
