- A 45 year old male (unvaccinated) with comorbidities died of respiratory failure due to COVID-19 pneumonia on 18th of April.
- A 77 year old female (2 doses + booster), with comorbidities died of sepsis due to COVID-19 illness on 20th April.
- An 85 year old male (unvaccinated), with comorbidities died of respiratory failure due to COVID-19 pneumonia on 22nd April.
- A 91 year old female (unvaccinated), with comorbidities, died from septic shock due to COVID-19 with multiple organ failure on 29th April.

Note: There are other deaths among registered cases that are not primarily caused by COVID-19.




Figure 1. COVID-19 epicurve – New daily confirmed community cases by date of notification

Note: The cut off for daily reporting is 2pm, therefore numbers reporting after 2pm will be reflected in the next reporting periods' count.





Figure 2. Weekly total of community cases vs 7-day rolling average

Figure 4. COVID-19 related deaths by age group and sex



Figure 5. COVID-19 positive community cases in the last 7 days - April 24 at 2pm - May 1 at 2pm, 2022




Figure 6. COVID-19 positive community cases by age group and sex in the last 7 days – April 24 at 2pm – May 01 at 2pm, 2022



IV. Repatriation flights and quarantine update

As of 02:00pm Local Time May 01, 2022

- A chartered flight from Pago Pago arrived on April 30, 2022 with no passengers. The 2 pilots are quarantined at Sheraton Mulifanua.
 - Both were tested on arrival and returned negative rapid antigen test results.
- A repatriation flight, QF333 from Brisbane Australia arrived on April 27, 2022 with 101 passengers.
 - All passengers were tested on arrival and returned 1 positive COVID-19 PCR test result.
 - Repeated swabs on Day 4 (April 30, 2022) and returned no new COVID-19 positive cases.
- A repatriation flight, NZ990 from Auckland New Zealand arrived on April 24, 2022 with 266 passengers.
 - All passengers were tested on arrival and returned 1 positive COVID-19 PCR test result.
 - Repeated swabs on Day 5 (April 28, 2022) and returned 3 additional COVID-19 positive cases.
 - Repeated swabs on Day 8 (May 01, 2022) and returned no new COVID-19 positive cases.
- A special chartered flight arrived from Pago Pago on April 21, 2022 with 2 passengers.
 - They were swabbed on Day 2 (April 22, 2022) and returned negative COVID-19 PCR results.
 - Repeated swabs on Day 5 (April 25, 2022) and returned negative COVID-19 PCR results.

^{*}All people travelling overseas are assessed by the public health doctors for medical clearance and tested for COVID-19 (if required) prior to their travel.

- Repeated swabs on Day 10 (April 30, 2022) and returned negative COVID-19 PCR results.
- The 2 passengers were discharged on May 01, 2022.
