Except for Pre-schools, all schools to restart this month

Pre-schools will remain closed until July 4th while the rest of public, private and mission schools from primary to colleges are authorised by Cabinet to return to class by the end of May.

In making the decision, Cabinet took into account the safety of the young pre-schoolers and teenagers (5 to 17 years old) who had recently received the COVID 19 vaccines.

“Vaccination rates remain a critical component of our response, especially for the 5 to 11 years cohort who have just completed their second dose, and who according to the Ministry of Health’s advice, will need at least two weeks to acquire full immunisation effectiveness against the COVID 19,” reiterated Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa Monday evening.

This is evidenced According to the Ministry of Health by 8th May 97.4% of the 40,638 children in 5-11 years old age bracket have had their first dose representing 39,574 children from 5

BORDERS TO OPEN TO EVERYONE ON 1ST OF AUGUST 2022

Weekly international flights to commence this Sunday: PM Fiame

Samoa is joining neighbouring countries like New Zealand, Australia and Fiji to cautiously open her international borders in line with the “Living with COVID19” way forward endorsed by Government.

And according to Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa on 1st August 2022, Samoa’s borders will be opened to everyone.

Meanwhile, weekly flights will start as early as this Sunday as a lead up to once a week flights from New Zealand and Australia and fortnightly flights from Fiji scheduled to commence in June, says the Prime Minister Monday night as she announced the two week extension for Samoa to maintain her Alert Level 2 response to the COVID19 outbreak.

“Beginning from the flight this Sunday, 22nd May, all booking reservations, and

Amendments to COVID19 restrictions; Alert Level 2 retained

There will be no more curfew after 10:00pm among other changes approved by Cabinet to ease local COVID19 restrictions, including the resumption of teaching in schools.

In announcing the 2 week Alert Level 2 extension, Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa also informed the country to changes made to the State of Emergency Orders, (SOE) effective midnight Tuesday 17th February 2022.

Said the Prime Minister in her announcement Monday evening;

“Further, as we have just implemented new quarantine measures for home isolation for passengers it is vital that we carefully monitor these new measures particularly compliance and monitoring.

“In this connection, Cabinet this afternoon approved that the country remains at alert level 2, for another two weeks from Tuesday midnight, 17th May, 2022 to midnight of Tuesday 31st May, 2022.

“New changes introduced under these State of Emergency Orders include the following:

1. Removal of curfew hours which now allow people greater mobility throughout the whole day.
2. The referral of airline bookings and all other related airline arrangements to airline companies and travel agents for all travels to and from Samoa beginning on the 22nd May, 2022.
3. Opening of our national borders to everyone on the 1st of August 2022.

4. The resumption of Colleges, Post-Secondary Education Training on 18th May, 2022, primary schools on the 30th May, and pre-schools on the 4th July, 2022.

All other SOE Orders remain unchanged.

Government through the usual channels will communicate details of these Orders.

LATEST REPORT AND DATA

The Ministry of Health confirmed from its latest report, that from the 10th to the 12th of May, 358 new community cases were identified, taking the total number of cases for Samoa to 11,671 including repatriated passengers.

Six people are currently isolated at the Moto’otua hospital with none at the ICU.

It is encouraging to note that most of the people who contracted the virus have made full recoveries, the Prime Minister pointed out.

A total of 88,483 RAT tests have been administered and testing continues at all district hospitals in the country and private General Practitioner clinics.

One person sadly passed away during this period, taking the number of deaths to 24.

“We continue to keep you in our prayers,” reiterated the Prime Minister Fiame in extending the Governments condolences to the families and loved ones of those persons who have passed away due to complications of the virus.

to 11 years ago.

This is complemented by 83.5% or 33,394 who have had their 2 doses to complete the vaccination cycle.

In the 12-17 year old age group with a population eligible to receive the vaccines of 28,245 children, 101.3% of the targeted 27,880 children have had their first dose with 88.3% or 24,617 have completed the vaccination.

With the high coverage, Cabinet has since authorized the resumption of classes this month with the National University of Samoa restarting classes on May 10th.

In addition, all Colleges including those of the government, private and mission will resume this Wednesday, 18th May 2022.

Primary schools will resume on Monday, 30th May, 2022 and pre-schools will resume on Monday, 4th July, 2022.

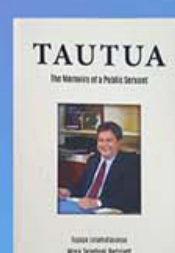

Samoa imposes strict requirements for Inter-Island Travel with Am. Samoa

A Supervised NEGATIVE Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) is compulsory to be done on the Day of departure from American Samoa for travellers to Samoa.

The RAT test must be supervised by a registered medical profession with a signed written report to be presented at check in and on arrival into Samoa.

In addition, a medical Clearance signed by attending physician within 48 hours before departure is also compulsory. And the medical clearance report must be presented in hard copy on arrival.

As an extra precaution, with the Omicron Community transmission in the territory spreading rapidly in recent weeks, all passengers entering Samoa from Pago Pago will go into quarantine for at least 10 days or as determined by the Ministry of Health (up to 21 days or more if tested positive in quarantine).

Only Samoan Residents/Citizen, essential workers and those approved for medical and visa clearance are allowed to enter Samoa.

Details of the Travel Advisory for travel from American Samoa issued by the Ministry of Health is published below verbatim.

SPECIAL TRAVEL ADVICE FOR TRAVELLERS FROM AMERICAN SAMOA ENTERING SAMOA, April 28th 2022. (MINISTRY OF HEALTH.)

COVID19 Variants affecting our region and the global communities is noted with much concern, hence our Border control efforts is elevated and strictly enhanced.

EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY;

ALL passengers are advised to communicate straight to the Samoa Health Authorities at least 21 days before planned travel time by emailing enouresiccehealth.eov.ws or samoahealth.travelenquiries@gmail.com for clarification pertaining to this travel advise.

All Passengers travelling from outside of American Samoa must complete ten (10) days from the date of arrival into American Samoa. Any passenger arriving within the 10 day period will be denied entry and returned back to American Samoa.

All travelers will be assessed on a case-by-case basis before being granted permission to travel to Samoa. A passenger holding a valid airline ticket to Samoa has been pre-approved by the Samoan Government to travel.

Only Samoan Residents/Citizen, essential workers and those approved for medical and visa clearance are allowed to enter Samoa.

THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS ARE ENFORCED AND MUST BE COMPLIED WITH.

ALL DOCUMENTS MUST BE IN ENGLISH - ANY OTHER LANGUAGE WILL BE DENIED BOARDING WITHOUT EXCEPTION.

1. All Travelers 5 years and above including flight crew are NOW required to be fully vaccinated with the prescribed 2 doses with the exception of Janssen vaccine before entry into Samoa with any COVID-19 vaccine and preferably vaccines already pre-qualified by the World Health Organization (AstraZeneca, Pfizer, Janssen-single dose, Moderna, Sinopharm, etc).

2. A legitimate vaccine certificate is required for boarding. Being fully vaccinated implies completion of the required prescribed doses as per vaccine used. All should have completed 2 weeks (14 days) post vaccination prior to travel. The vaccine certificate must be a Health Authority Approved Certificate/Card of country where vaccination took place and should contain at least the following information:

- a. Name of Country
- b. Name of person - should be the same as name on passport or birth certificate
- c. National Identification/Registration Number if available
- d. Address of Clinic and contact details
- e. Name of Vaccine and Batch Number
- f. Dates of Vaccination
- g. Name of Vaccinator (optional)
- H. Health Institution Stamp if available

3. A hard copy of vaccine certificate must be presented at check in and on arrival into Samoa for sighting and also during registration at quarantine/isolation facilities.

4. Encourage all eligible passengers to have a booster dose done prior to travel.

5. Medical Clearance signed by attending physician within 48 hours before departure. The medical clearance report must be presented in hard copy on arrival.

6. A Supervised NEGATIVE Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) done on the Day of departure from American Samoa. The RAT must be supervised by a registered medical profession with a signed written report to be presented at check in and on arrival

into Samoa.

7. All passengers entering Samoa from Pago Pago will go into quarantine for at least 10 days or as determined by the Ministry of Health (up to 21 days or more if tested positive in quarantine).

8. Due to limited quarantine sites and rooms available we can only accept and accommodate a maximum of 40 passengers per week.


Your compliance with the conditions listed is imperative to ensuring the safety of all travelers and our people in Samoa. We endeavor to keep Samoa COVID-19 Free.

Travellers are also required to download the Samoa Travel Tracer app onto their phones before travel. You can download the app from the Samoa Tourism Authority website or directly from Google play for android and Apple for iPhones or use the following links:



NEW ARRIVALS HOME RELEASE DIRECTIVE PUT TO THE TEST

Passengers tested negative at the Faleolo Airport upon arrival will not be detained for isolation for a minimum of 7 days per the usual border restrictions instead they will be granted home release.

Under a new directive approved by Cabinet and signed into law by the Head of State arrivals tested negative at the airport are granted home release provided they undergo home isolation for 7 days before mingling with relatives and or making any public appearances.

Arrivals tested positive will remain subject to Quarantine and Isolation Protocols in place.

The new home release policy was put to the test last weekend with two repatriation flights for Samoans flying in from Fiji and New Zealand.

“N.E.O.C. is facilitating our Health Ministry with the protocols to minimize any confusion at the airport when the flights arrived,” Disaster Advisory Committee Chairman Agafili Tomaimano Shem Leo announced during a Press Conference this week.

“Imagine dealing with over 200 passengers? It’s a huge ask,” noted the DAC Chairman.

He assured the public that authorities will be putting in place the necessary process to ensure the clearance from the terminal is as quickly as they possibly can without any incident and at the same maintain border security mandates without further compromising the security of the country.

The Home Release initiative is seen as saving costs and prompted by the high vaccine coverage of close to 93% of the country’s eligible population



of close to 130,000 receiving the two doses of vaccines to complete their protection cycle.

As a precaution, close to 80% of the same population have had their third dose, (booster) while health teams continue to march on with the Vaccination Drive across the country for the 5 year old

age group up to the adults and senior citizens.

For the readers’ information, Government repatriation costs has drained close to \$30 million tala from her coffers to pay for accommodation, meals, personnel etc.

Since 2020 till now when the borders were

opened only for returning Samoans, 9,079 citizens have returned home from New Zealand and Australia as the two respective top destinations.

For this year alone, 1,250 returning residents have arrived home safely

other airline arrangements for flights coming into and out of Samoa will be handed back to airline companies and travel agents, as have been the normal procedures before our borders were closed,” elaborated the Prime Minister during her nationwide address streamlined lived by the Government’s Press Secretariat.

“The services for registration that were done through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade have now reverted back to the airlines offices using both on-line and onsite services.

“The traveling public is advised to do bookings online with the relevant airline companies,” continued the Prime Minister.

Critical to the Samoa Governments’ decision to slowly open the country’s borders are the current rates of the vaccination program, amendments to quarantine conditions and the opening of borders of our neighboring countries, like Australia and Fiji as well as New Zealand.

The first step to reopen the borders began with entry allowed for all Samoans, resident in Samoa and travel on Samoan passports,

Samoans that travel on foreign passports but with exemption stamps for entry as well as foreign contracted workers with the relevant work and temporary resident permits.

And after reassessing the Governments’ preparations to reopen the borders for international travellers as initially announced, Prime Minister Fiame reiterated that “important consideration was given to our current rates of vaccinations, sector planning for the reopening of our borders especially the private and business sector, as well as the experiences of other neighbouring countries.”

“Vaccination remains our best defence against severe effects of COVID 19, leading to hospitalisation or death,” continued the Prime Minister,

To date;


- 92.9% of people in the age group 18 years and above have completed vaccinations
- 88.3% in the age group 12 to 17 have completed vaccinations
- 83.5% for the age group 5 to 11 have completed vaccinations
- A total of 74,218 booster doses have been administered.
- As of current our vaccination programs for these age groups continue at all district hospitals and centres at the Moto’otua hospital.

Last weekend, new quarantine requirements for travelling passengers were implemented, which now require all passengers to self-isolate at home for seven days.

Strict health measures and conditions have been put in place to ensure that these passengers adhere to reporting of their test results on the third and seventh day to the Ministry of Health.

A breach of these home isolation health requirements will incur a fine of SAT\$2000.00.

A report from the Ministry of Health and the Disaster Advisory Committee on the two flights from Fiji and New Zealand arriving over the weekend is anticipated to be made public in the coming days.

Samoa presents Credentials to the Director General of the United Nations Office in Geneva

(PRESS RELEASE); On 11 of May 2022, Samoa became the 182nd United Nations Member State to be accredited to the United Nations Office in Geneva (UNOG) following the presentation of credentials of the first Permanent Representative of Samoa in Geneva, Toleafoa Nella Pepe Tavita-Levy, to the Director General of UNOG, Tatiana Valovaya.

Toleafoa was appointed by the Government of Samoa earlier this year as Ambassador and Permanent Representative of Samoa in Geneva. She was the Assistant Chief Executive Officer of Trade at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade since April 2016. Prior to that, she served as Counsellor at the Embassy of Samoa in Brussels from 2012 to 2016.

The Permanent Representative now formally estab-

lishes the first Permanent Mission of Samoa in Geneva.

This is a milestone achievement for the Government of Samoa, signifying the importance of strengthening relations with the United Nations and other international organisations in Geneva; and bilateral relations with the Swiss Government. Samoa's presence in Geneva will provide the direct opportunity to contribute to the discussions shaping global responses to areas of importance to Samoa including sustainable development, Human Rights, health and COVID-19 response, trade, connectivity, climate change, etc.

The Permanent Mission of Samoa will strengthen Pacific and SIDS voices in Geneva; and joins Australia, Fiji, Marshall Islands, Nauru, New Zealand and Vanuatu of the Pacific Forum permanent missions in Geneva.

Returning Samoans residents: TAKE NOTE & BE WARNED

Returning Samoan residents and essential workers heading to Samoa, please TAKE NOTE.

Kindly read and comply the compulsory details contained in the new Travel Advise issued Saturday 14th May 2022 articulating the Updated Border Security mandates ordered by the Ministry of Health sealed by law by Samoa's State of Emergency Orders designed to protect the country from imported COVID19.

LAST CALL & FINAL WARNING TO ALL- Returning Samoan residents and essential workers heading home, please TAKE NOTE.

"With the current emergence of the COVID-19 Omicron variants with imminent spread to other countries including Samoa; Samoa's borders are closed to all travelers except returning residents and essential workers only," the Travel Advice stated.

It lists the mandates which include the compulsory protocols for all incoming travelers to obtain a negative COVID tests done 24 hours to be presented before boarding and on arrival and only certified and official hard copy documentation to support the negative results are accepted. You are also highly recommended to have your booster doses. Otherwise be prepared to be left behind.

Also on arrival prior to getting the home release greenlight after satisfying the negative test results, there are stringent requirements in place as follows;

ON ARRIVAL INTO SAMOA:

- a. All passengers are required to wear face mask at all times.
 - b. All passengers on arrival must submit to a Nasal pharyngeal Swab for PCR testing.
 - c. All passengers or guardian must sign a consent for self/home isolation
 - d. All passengers must self/home isolate for 7 days
 - e. All passengers must provide a valid local phone number and email/Facebook address.
 - f. All passengers are required to arrange and have a medical supervised Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) done at any health facility or private clinic on day 3 and day 7 of self/home isolation and report results to the Ministry of Health.
 - g. Self-Testing at home is NOT acceptable.
 - h. Any passenger with a POSITIVE test must self/home isolate for 10 days from the date tested positive with a repeat test done on day 10.
 - i. All close contacts of a positive case must also self/home isolate for 7 days with RAT test done on day 7.

5. All Travelers age 12 years and above including flight crew are required to be fully vaccinated with the prescribed 2 doses preferably of vaccines pre-qualified by the World Health Organization (Astra-Zeneca, Pfizer, Janssen-single dose, Moderna, Sinopharm, Sinovac, Covaxin, Novavax) before entry into Samoa;

7. A hard copy of vaccine certificate must be presented at check in and on arrival into Samoa for sighting and also during registration. Electronic documents on phones or other electronic device including email are NOT acceptable.

8. Passengers with medical conditions that deem them exempt for Vaccination must email the aforementioned email addresses in advance with a written report from a registered medical officer stating reasons for exemption;

The Ministry reserves the right to deny boarding if it is not satisfied with the medical report provided;

9. A Negative Nucleic Acid Amplification Test (NAAT) - (RT-PCR, NEAR, TMA, LAMP or SDA) by Nasal Pharyngeal Swab or Saliva test required to be taken within 48 hours of departure from originating airport for all passengers including children and infants as well as flight crew. RAPID TEST RESULTS; Self-Register with MoH.

Residents are urged to (Self-Report) register with the Ministry of Health results of their rapid tests they conducted on their own even if the results are positive.

From May 01st till the 8th over 50 individuals had registered their positive rapid test results via on-line and since the on-line registration was activated over 1,000 positive cases voluntary reported their positive results, Deputy Director General of Health Tagaloa Dr. Robert Thompson revealed during a press conference this week.

And he is urging the public register because the statistics will assist health authorities to analyze and formulate effective containment measures to minimize the spread and threat of the virus in the community.

Tagaloa notes that employees, (public servants included) who had rapid test independently and did not register with health cannot receive the medical certificate needed by employers to justify their absence from work.

"We have denied a substantial number requests from employees needing a medical certificate because they tested positive but did not self-register," said the Deputy Director. And he recalled a similar miscommunication with family members who did not report their loss of loved ones during the Measles Outbreak and later threatened and harassed health authorities for a death certificate to receive Government assistance.

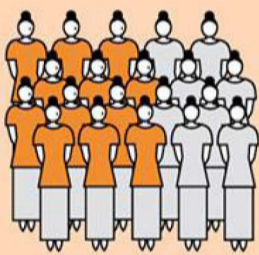
