

Ready to serve and protect - Commissioner Auapauau

From recruitment of more police officers to retaining public confidence coupled by capacity building officers to realize their full potentials as law enforcers are a few of the priorities on the newly appointed Commissioner of Police and Prisons Auapauau Logoitino Filipo's microscope.

Endorsed by Cabinet last week, the 51-year old seasonal police officer of 24 years sat down with the Savali for an exclusive One

on One interview.

"Among the top priorities include boosting the cooperation Ministry with not only the Alii and Faipule and communities, but strengthen partnerships with Government Ministries, donor partners, and Non-Governmental Organisations to ensure the safety of the public," Commissioner said.

And the force will left unchecked with special attention to establish an independent body that will investigate complaints against police officers.

The Prizes to be finalized will be financed by the Accident Compensation Corporation, (A.C.C.)


One of the main attractions in part Independence Celebrations, fautasi racing has been absent since the Measles Epidemic and the on-going COVID19 pandemic headaches.

Press Release: Situational Report (29th June to 01st July, 2022) on COVID-19 in Samoa

The Ministry of Health in its latest COVID-19 situation report commencing from 29th of June to 01st of July 2022, confirmed 31 positive cases. Of this number, there are 17 new community cases and 14 new imported cases, taking the total number of cases (community and border) to 14,995.

While the country continues to be on alert level 1, it is important that we continue to heed public health advice to maintain good personal hygiene, to help to contain the spread of the virus, and to prevent new infections. The safety of our families and loved ones is everyone's responsibility.

Vaccination remains our best defense against severe effects of the virus. Eligible members of the public are requested to please visit the nearest hospital for their first or second dose, and booster shot.

The rehabilitation of prisoners at the Tanumalala prison is also on the priority list of the new Commissioner, stating that the Ministry continues to work with the Samoa Qualifications Authority to accredit programmes undertaken at Tanumalala, so that prisoners upon release will be able to seek employment.

The Commissioner further explained that with review conducted by New Zealand on the structure of the Ministry, there should be more than 1000 law enforcers, but he then clarified that this cannot be done at the moment.

"This number cannot be achieved right now due to the high turnover of staff leaving the force for greener pastures, like for example, for seasonal work overseas."

"Others left to work in other Government Ministries and a handful have resigned," he said.

With over 700 police officers in the country, Auapauu is looking into a way to attract the attention of the public, especially those who have graduated from various institutions, to boost the numbers of those serving in the force.

While looking for ways to increase the number of police officers in Samoa, Auapauu is also determined to upskill current law enforcers, including ways to address cybercrime.

The Ministry's partnership with Australia and New Zealand continues to remain strong says the Commissioner and will continue to work side by side with donor partners to address the needs of the police force.

Auapauu, a father of six, gives thanks to his wife and children for their support and help throughout the 24 years he has served the Ministry.

"I give thanks to our Father in Heaven for this appointment, as all

appointments come from God," he said.

"I thank the Prime Minister and the Cabinet for having faith in me to become the Police Commissioner, I feel thankful and humbled."

Auapauu also gives thanks to his church Minister Rev. Amosa Reupena and his wife, he is also thankful for the support his family in Samoa and overseas has shown him throughout his journey in becoming Samoa's Police Commissioner.

The new Commissioners' leadership resume includes managing District Operations in the Community complemented by his impressive performance to Command the Pacific Islands Police Contingent, (RAMSI) for four years in the Solomon Islands.

According to a reference from the Commander of the Entire RAMSI Operations which included New Zealand, Australia and participating countries, Commissioner Auapauu was ranked very highly in his significant contributions in resolving difficult policing operations as well as modelling extremely high standards of performances and behaviors at the top most end of the executive spectrum.

Graduating from Samoa College in 1981, Auapauu joined the Samoa Police Services as a Constable in 1998, climbing up through thanks of Corporal, Sergeant, Super Intendent, Police Supervisor, Assistant Commissioner, and now the Police Commissioner.

He attended many trainings overseas such as management at the Australia Institute of Police in 2017, Federal Law Enforcement in Georgia USA in 2002. Auapauu was also the held the position of Commander of Regional Assistance Mission to Solomon Islands (R.A.M.S.I.) from 2014 – 2017.

Auapauu takes over from former Police Commissioner Fuiavailili Egon Keil who resigned in August last year.

\$66.7 million dividend payout for Fiscal Year 2021-2022

SNPF celebrates new achievements with new record breaking dividend payout

New achievements and record breaking cash payouts marks the start of the new Fiscal Year 2022-2023 for the Samoa National Provident Fund, (SNPF) Board of Directors acting on recommendations from the Funds' Management.

For starters, the Board has approved a new record breaking dividend payout to her 130,000 plus contributors totaling \$66.7 million tala or 8.2% dividend.

And setting the precedent the 8.2% to be paid out in three installments will be in cash with no strings attached. "It is in that regard that the Fund has resolved to pay out an unprecedented 100% of this year's interest declared in cash as our unique contribution to the national effort to inspire growth," reiterate a Press Release.

That is just icing on the cake as the SNPF also unveiled a number of milestone achieved in the last 12 months.

"In this Golden Jubilee year celebrating the 50th anniversary since its establishment, we also celebrate the landmark achievement of surpassing 1 billion tala net-assets for the first time – making SNPF the first institution in Samoa to do so.

"Furthermore, as we celebrate Samoa's 60th independence anniversary, the Board realises that our economy needs urgent financial stimulus and heeds our government's call for "Inspiring Growth through an inclusive and resilient recovery for Samoa."

Mindful of the economic and financial turbulence due to the COVID19 pandemic, SNPF resorted to pay out the dividends earlier than usual in April this year. Labeled as the Interim cash payout Dividend of 3.0% translating to \$24.4 million tala, it was the first of three interests paid to the Fund members for the Fiscal year.

The early disbursement according to Minister of Finance Mulipola Anarosa Ale Molio'o is a financial cushion to help members cope with the COVID19 challenges.

The second dividend installment of 3.2% will be available

on-line only, for the Funds' contributors effective tomorrow 1st July 2022. It will amount to \$26.2 million tala cash going directly into the members pockets and bank accounts.

Members have the option to either cash in on the 2nd dividend installment or not with the interest to be deposited in their accounts at their discretion.

And in December the last 2% dividend installment equivalent to \$16.27 million tala will be distributed.

In a nutshell, total dividend or interest paid to members will be \$66.7 million tala, the highest interest paid since the SNPF was established, says SNPF Chief Executive Pauli Prince Suhren in a press conference Tuesday morning with Finance Minister Mulipola.

The last highest dividend payout was for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 with total interests injected into the local economy in the neighborhood of \$60 million tala.

Scholarship recipients soon to commence studies in China

On the back burner for 2 years due to the COVID19 pandemic, 20 Samoan scholarship students who qualified to study in China for five years will be heading to the Republic when Samoa's international borders open on August 01st.

Every year, more than 20 students are awarded scholarships to study in institutions in China, but due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the program was suspended for safety reasons.

Acknowledging China full funding of the scholarship awards, Vaifale Lauatea Puletini Tuala of Leavaa who will be studying at the Beijing Language and Culture University for a Bachelor in Political Science thanked the People's Republic of China and the Government of Samoa for the golden opportunities.

"I speak tonight, not I alone, but on behalf of all the new Samoan students who are about to embark in their journey to explore better academic and scholastic settings and opportunities in your great country. I also speak on behalf of all our parents, our families and our friends," says Tuala during the award ceremony at the National University of Samoa (N.U.S.) Wednesday evening.

"The opportunity the people of China has continued to grant us year in and year out, and again this year, benefits not only, I alone, but my family and friends and all the people of Samoa in the future. We are the direct beneficiaries of your generosity. This is a classic example of human development. Thank you."

Waiting nearly two years to commence his studies in China, Mr. Tuala said that the pandemic has taught everyone a lesson to rethink the normal, rethink development and the nobility of education above else and above any circumstance.

"I thank your government for allowing us to come to China while the world tries to conquer the pandemic. I thank you for your forward thinking as always, for the show must go on and education should

not be halted," Tuala acknowledging the Ambassador of China to Samoa Chao Xiaoliang for China's contribution to education in Samoa.

In response, Ambassador Xiaoliang reassured the mutual and beneficial cooperation between the two countries.

Ambassador Chao highlighted the long-standing traditions of people-to-people interactions

between China and Samoa focusing on education cooperation such as the Chinese Government scholarships that were launched in 1982.

"Even the pandemic couldn't cease our pace. I'm happy to say the awardees of Chinese government scholarship program will travel to China for their studies later this year," Ambassador Chao said.

35 NEW POLICE OFFICERS GRADUATE FROM ACADEMY

The 35 new officers who graduated from the Police Academy will hit the ground running but not without well wishes and encouragements from their Minister Faualo Lefau Harry Schuster.

In his congratulatory speech, Faualo, a lawyer by profession reminded the new law enforcers that their primary duty and responsibility is to serve and protect.

"The profession of being a police officer, it's not an easy profession," elaborated Faualo.

"Seasons change, times change, but what doesn't change are the duties of a police officer which are to prevent crime, to protect the community, and property and life, and to maintain peace."

"Those core duties never change, so they have been called to the challenge to protect those for us," he continued.

"It's not an easy profession, but there are guidelines that will guide them in the most difficult profession. First guideline as a Samoan, is to rely on God. God will show the way.

"And the second guideline is to follow the law, obey the law. It's not easy being a policeman or a policewoman because in investigating crime you will have to lock somebody up, and in investigating that crime you may come across that someone you are close to, a friend, a relative is involved and you are called by your duty under the law to follow and take full measures according to the law to where they should go."

Faualo is more than ready to defend the uniform assuring the force that he's golden rule is for all officers to "Obey the law to the letter."

"If someone tells me, or complains to me accusing the alleged 200 per cent increase in crime in Samoa is a sign of failure for the force, I beg to differ," he said.

"In my humble opinion, as police officers when you disobey and violate the law, you are a failure as a police officer," he added noting that failure to enforce the law "without fear or favor," is labeled as a disgrace to the profession.

The graduation ceremony was held at the TATTE Convention Center with families and friends of the graduates cheering on the new recruits.

The Police Minister congratulated the new recruits, told everyone in attendance that being a Police officer is not an easy job.

In an exclusive interview with the Savali, Ms. Ami hailing from Fagamalo and pursing a Bachelor in History had nothing but praises for the life line of \$2,000 tala in financial aid to help with her education costs.

"It's an Academic Miracle," says the 24 year old.

"In the midst of a pandemic you never failed to aid us in schooling so that we can achieve our Academic Goals," she told the Savali Newspaper.

"I am deeply honoured because of what has been offered by your lovely Nation and people. Seeing the struggle my family has to go through trying to fund for all my siblings including my own education at such difficult time financially this scholarship indeed is a Blessing.

"Being awarded a scholarship that adds up to 2,000 Tala is an Academic Miracle and now I don't have to worry about having my parents and family pay for school for the upcoming semester," she continued.

In announcing the new financial assistance, Ambassador of China to Samoa Chao Xiaoliang that grants is in line with China's national policy that "Education shapes the future of a nation."

"The Chinese Ambassador Scholarship has been officially set up this year with the aim to award students with best performance in academy or extracurricular activities, and to financially support vulnerable students with merits," he said.

"The awardees with us tonight represent an impressive array of research fields, ranging from agricultural science to information and communication technology, which are key sectors for the development of your motherland."

Ambassador Chao also reminded the 20 students that as pioneers of the initial financial aid, they will shoulder the burden of doubt to ensure that the grants program will continue to prosper and bear fruits.

Under the Ambassador's Scholarships Award, there are two categories which include;

- Encourage Scholarships \$2,000
- Excellent Student \$500-\$1,000.

The Award is separate from the full Scholarship Program by China which provides five year scholarships for Samoan to study in China.




