48 Electoral Constituencies sign up for the \$1 million District Development Project

Out of the 51 Electoral Constituencies, 48 have signed up for the Government's \$1 million tala District Development project initiated by Government.

Confirming the rapid endorsement increase by Electoral Constituencies, Chief Executive Officer of the Ministry of Women Community and Social Development Dr. Mema Motusaga in an exclusive interview with the Savali Newspaper shared the process in implementing the project.

For example, she says that July 31st is the dead-

line for Constituencies to meet a range of mandated requirements for eligibility.

They include:

- Establishment of a Central District Development Center to centralize administration and coordination of community projects.
- Each Center must have three qualified full time staff under the supervision of an Executive Officer
- Finalize community projects to be funded by the grant.

4 viruses circulating in the community

Four flu viruses are circulating in the community the Ministry of Health has confirmed.

In an exclusive interview with the Savali Newspaper, Acting Director of Health Tagaloa Dr. Robert Thompsen identified the four flu virus as;

1. Influenza A
2. Influenza B
3. Respiratory Syncytial Virus
4. COVID-19

“There is quite a high number of people tested positive for Influenza B,” said Tagaloa.

Influenza B is highly contagious and symptoms include;

- Fever
- Chills
- Sore Throat
- Coughing
- Runny Nose
- Sneezing, Fatigue
- Muscle Aches
- Body Aches

For the Respiratory Syncytial Virus it is also contagious and the symptoms include;

- Runny Nose
- Loss Of Appetite
- Coughing
- Sneezing
- Fever
- Wheezing

For treatment, Tagaloa highly recommends the public to treat the four flu virus like the COVID-19 and precautionary measures including rest, drink lots of fluids and isolate at home.

“Some people have the flu, but they are still going to work,” he added.

“Stay home and take precautions. This would stop the flu from spreading to others.”

The same flu virus are circulating in New Zealand and Australia and with the high number of people travelling into the country, Tagaloa containing imported flu is unavoidable.

The symptoms will affect an individual for 3 to 5 days, and Tagaloa strong advised to consult a doctor.

Monkeypox disease under the microscope

The Ministry of Health is keeping a vigil that the contagiously and fatal monkeybox disease will not infiltrate Samoa’s border.

MoH’s is on alert after receiving reports that monkeypox cases are surfacing in New Zealand.

Ministry of Health’s Acting Chief Executive Officer Tagaloa Dr. Robert Thompsen told the Savali Newspaper that they are keeping an eye on the situation in Australia and New Zealand.

“So far we haven’t heard any new cases in Australia, New Zealand just recorded their first case,” Tagaloa said.

He confirmed that the Ministry is monitoring the situation as it develops.

“The public will be informed if anything new comes up,” he said.

“Monkeypox has been around for quite some time but at the moment there are cases being reported from other countries so we are monitoring it to see if this virus is now able to be airborne or just

through contact.”

Tagaloa says that there is little information available to confirm whether the current monkeypox virus is airborne.

With no cure for the virus, Tagaloa said that regardless of the virus, precautionary measures remain the same such as avoiding overcrowded places, stay home, wear a face mask, and get enough rest.

Symptoms of monkeypox can include:

- Fever
- Headache
- Muscle aches and backache
- Swollen lymph nodes
- Chills
- Exhaustion

A rash that can look like pimples or blisters that appears on the face, inside the mouth, and on other parts of the body, like the hands, feet, chest, genitals, or anus.

48 Electoral Constituencies sign up for the \$1 million District Development Project

Dr. Motusaga elaborated that right now the districts are going through the motions which include building a Center and recruiting full time staff for the respective Centers.

Some of the Constituencies are operating from rental office space on a temporary arrangement while construction is underway on a permanent office.

As for recruitment, MWCSO is in charge of advertising the post while the Member of Parliament is responsible for shortlisting, in-

terviews and appointing qualified applicants. And there are compulsory requirement for applicants to be considered for the vacancies.

They must be a registered voter of the Electoral Constituency and a permanent resident, living 24-7 in the constituency.

Of the 48 Constituencies on board, 6 have opened their centers.

They are:

2. Sagaga 4
3. Gagaemauga 2
4. Aleipata itupa I lalo
5. Aana Alofi 1
6. Falealili 2

The District Development Project is a Government initiative designed to provide ownership for electoral constituencies, residents and voters to have a say in development projects that they see fit in their best interests and benefits.

We are bringing medals, says SASNOC President

Team Samoa will be heading soon to Birmingham, England to represent their at the XXII Commonwealth Games.

And the President of the Samoa Association of Sports and National Olympic Committee Pauaga Talalelei Pauga has high hopes for gold medals.

Speaking to the Savali Newspaper, Pauga says that Team Samoa is ready as they have been preparing for over a year.

“Before we left for Saipan, I made a general statement saying that we are bringing medals back, and I can say as well we are bringing medals back,” he said.

“We have high hopes for a gold medal.”

Calling this team their strongest team ever, Pauga is confident with the team’s performance in recent tournaments, in particular the weightlifting squad, and the country’s rugby sevens team.

He had given his well wishes for the team, telling them to play for

their country, and also for their families that are supporting them.

“We will do our best,” he said.

Team Samoa’s 60-strong athletes will represent their country in seven sports in Birmingham, England, starting on July 28.

The athletes are selected from local and overseas based elite athletes in seven sports - athletics, boxing, judo, rugby 7s, swimming, weightlifting, and wrestling. The men’s rugby sevens team and officials will be the first to depart Samoa today followed by the rest of Team Samoa a week later.

Samoa won five medals in the 2018 Commonwealth Games on the Gold Coast, including two gold medals by weightlifters.

Altogether Samoa has won 25 medals - 13 in boxing, 11 in weightlifting and one in athletics since it first entered the Games in 1974. All its five golds have been in weightlifting.

Finance Minister Mulipola for Early Childhood Development

**OPENING REMARKS AT THE PCR4ECD STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING BY
HON. MULIPOLA ANAROSA ALE-MOLIOO MINISTER OF FINANCE –
SAMOA/ CO-CHAIR, PACIFIC REGIONAL COUNCIL FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT.**

(14th July 2022, UNICEF FDB Building, Suva, Fiji)- Honourable Ifereimi Waqainabete, esteemed colleagues from across the Pacific Region and the United Nations.

Talofa lava! Bula Vinaka and Greetings to you all,

It gives me great pleasure to address you today at this Pacific Regional Council for Early Childhood Development Steering Committee Meeting.

As a region that is faced with limited resources and separated by the vast Pacific Ocean, we rely heavily on and put much emphasis on our human capital. That emphasis comes with the commitment of ensuring a safe and secure environment whereby our children – the future of our Pacific – is a priority.

Our attendance as representatives of our respective countries in this week's event say a lot about our Pacific leaders and our Council's collective commitment to helping young children across the Pacific reach their full potential through coordinated action and investment in early childhood development.

We welcome and fully support the work that is now underway led by our PRC4ECD initiative to assist our Pacific countries complete their national, multi-sectoral Early Childhood Development policies with costed action plans, and multi-sectoral Early Childhood Development Monitoring and Evaluation Frameworks.

Like Climate Change, Early Childhood Development action is urgent for our Pacific region as we see deteriorating learning outcomes over the years. Whilst we are encouraged to see the progress made to date, we should not lose sight of the challenges and threats we continue to face as countries that hinder our progress on Early Childhood Development.

For the majority of our countries, 14 out of 16 countries have no data on Early Childhood Development Index (ECDI) – this overall index score captures the percentage of children age 3-5 who are on track in at least 3 of 4 domains of (1) Language/literacy, (2) Numeracy, (3) Physical and (4) Socio-emotional and Cognitive Development. Limited data is also available to determine where our countries stand in terms of the "Lifetime Cost of Growth Deficit in Early Childhood" – this is the estimated economic costs of poor early development.

In February 2022 this year, our government launched its National Strategy titled "Pathway for the Development of Samoa 2021/22 – 2025/26" or PDS. It is a major shift in that sense that we as government really need to re-assess how best we allocate our resources including



external development funding to deliver improved public services to our people. One of the main Key Strategic Outcome in our Strategy is "Improved Social Development" which includes the focus on Key Priority Areas of "Improved Public Health", "Quality Education" and "People Empowerment" to name a few.

Our priorities are ambitious in terms of the timeline to deliver but they are our aspirations as a country therefore we need to play our part as the government of the day to set the right direction and ensure our development improve the wellbeing and lives of our people.

We are currently working to integrate into the different sector plans how best to deliver the overarching national key outcomes and part of the process is to also explore how to integrate some of the most urgent priorities such as Early Childhood Development in our relevant sector plans including Education and Health. We aspire as Pacific nations to do what is best for our families including the love we have for our children. We should not only speak but ensure there

are measurable actions to fast track our efforts to support and help our children reach their full potential– they are the future generations of this region.

The Government has started to scale up its support for community development through district programs that will see communities across the country take the lead in deciding and managing projects that will have positive impacts on their communities based on their unique priorities. The aspiration is to use these platforms to drive the Early Childhood message at the community level and establish it as a priority that can be owned at the grassroots level to be supported by the Government and its key partners. This remains but only one of many policy action examples that we as a region can take as an approach to addressing ECD.

Amongst the many challenges faced by Pacific Children today is Climate Change. It is understood that the environment within which a child grows largely affects their development and inevitably their futures. The effects of Climate

Change on our Pacific Island Countries will be felt the most by our youngest citizens, and it is up to us to ensure that proper policy actions are in place to ensure their resilience and adaptability so that their potentials are not affected.

In essence, the future is now.

The estimated economic costs of poor early childhood development on our economies and that of the region will be detrimental in years to come. We must not wait to react but be proactive and be prepared.

This why Honourable Minister and esteemed colleagues, I very much look forward to the contributions that will shape the outcomes of this meeting and wish you all the best in your deliberations.

In closing, I wish to thank the Government of Fiji as well as the UNICEF and organizers for bringing us here today. It is always a pleasure to visit the Fijian Islands and enjoy its hospitality!

Clean water gives families in Samoa a fresh start

(PRESS RELEASE)-Water is a crucial human resource, providing nourishment, hygiene, and crop growth.

For Samoan communities living in vulnerable villages, accessing water remains a challenge. Despite their proximity to town centres, people living in non-traditional villages experience constant hardship due to their lack of land ownership for food management. They do not benefit from government water sources offered near towns, while also lacking access to natural resources such as rivers and streams found in more traditional rural villages.

Around the islands of Upolu and Savai'i, water usually only flows during the night in certain villages and may be gone for days without notice. Some villages with independent water schemes face similar issues, with water only flowing through pipes for less than eight hours a day and none after rainfall.

To safeguard Samoan communities against water scarcity during the COVID-19 pandemic, Caritas Australia, in partnership with Caritas Samoa, began the Advancing Resilience through Resources for Outreach and Water Security (ARROWS) program, providing vulnerable Samoan households with dependable access to clean water.

Thanks to your generosity and support, Caritas Australia partnered with Caritas Samoa to install water tanks for 32 families in 17 villages (many being non-traditional) on the islands of Upolu and Savai'i. The newly installed tanks benefitted at least 400 people living with

unreliable access to water, including Tului.

For decades, Tului and her family of 13 endured the hardship of living with water scarcity, often collecting rainwater in buckets as their primary water source. Yet, the bucket collections were never enough, especially with extended periods of drought and sporadic events of extreme rainfall. Additionally, the collected water was constantly rationed and typically prioritised for the most urgent needs, including drinking and cooking, with days when there was not enough for even showering, cleaning or laundry.

Through the ARROWS program, Tului received a 3,000L tank in December 2021 and an effective stand-alone rainwater harvesting system. Since installation, the water tank has consistently been full from sporadic rainfall events, and now Tului and her family have enough water to meet their basic needs, and maintain a more hygienic environment.

With clean water for nourishment, they can also bathe more frequently, wash their clothes and clean food utensils to avoid spreading disease. The newly installed water tank ensures a safer and healthier life for Tului, her family and the many other families in her community.

"Even though it doesn't rain every day, now we can safely collect a lot more water when it rains and we have enough," says Tului. "I don't have to walk around looking for water with my children anymore but there are many families who still have to. I always share our water with those people because we have to always help one another. You helped me and now I have to help them."

“When our great, great-grandchildren look back in time, I am confident that they will identify this moment as the point in time where we as a region decided to change our course, our direction, and our destiny for the good of our people,” SG Puna said.

He assured Prime Minister Bainimarama of the Forum’s

commitment to the effective implementation of the 2050 Blue Pacific Strategy.

“On this front, I am also pleased to be joined by my fellow Heads of CROP Agencies. Because, together, our shared promise is that we will work together as regional agencies; we will marshal our collective resources, and we will align our agencies to support the vision and the objectives of the 2050 Strategy. This is indeed our shared commitment to Leaders, to Members, and the wider people of the Blue Pacific Continent.”

Fiji assumed the Chair of the Pacific Islands Forum in August 2021, under the leadership of Prime Minister Bainimarama.

Samoa edge Fiji to claim first Pacific Nations Cup title since 2014

(LAUTOKA, FIJI)- Manu Samoa have overturned a 17-3 half-time deficit to edge Fiji and claim their first Pacific Nations Cup title in eight years.

Rallying back with a strong showing in the second half, in which they ran in two tries to none, the Samoans held on to score a famous 23-20 victory at Churchill Park in Lautoka.

A late try to reserve hooker Seilala Lam in the final 10 minutes handed Samoa a lead they never lost again, even in spite of Fiji’s best efforts in the closing stages as they threatened Samoa’s tryline with a line-out from close range.

However, an overthrow by Tevita Ikanavere ensured Samoa retained possession and were able to hoof the ball out of play, much to the jubilation of the men in blue. The result didn’t come easily, though, as Fiji established themselves as the dominant force early on, cancelling out Rodney Iona’s opening penalty through an Albert Tuisue try from some tap-and-go trickery near the opposition line.

Both teams had their chances in what proved to be a baron scoring spell over the course of the next 20 minutes, but neither side could take full advantage of possession and territory as skill execution and discipline failed them.

That was until Fiji halfback

Frank Lomani’s individual brilliance extended Fiji’s lead as he stepped his way through the Samoan defence from the back of a scrum deep inside the opposition’s half near the half-hour mark.

Taking a 17-3 lead into the break,

with a Ben Volavola penalty further bolstering the home side’s lead, Fiji looked set to deny Samoa the title and gift the championship to Australia A, who had moved into pole position with a win over Tonga earlier in the afternoon.

Samoa weren’t deterred, though, as they slowly but surely fought their way back into the contest via a brace to Lam, whose try-scoring efforts were complemented by the Iona’s boot.

What transpired was a third-ever

Pacific Nations Cup crown, a major feat for Samoa as their World Cup preparations ramp up significantly heading into this November’s test window.

A date for the official opening is still under negotiations, according to the attaché of China's Embassy to Samoa Qi Jiangsu.


"The Friendship Park will be handed over soon," Ms. Qi told the Savali Newspaper.


