HISTORY IN THE MAKING

Cabinet's inaugural meeting in Savai'i

Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa and her Cabinet are in Samoa's history books as the first Cabinet to meet in Savai'i, 60 years after the country became independent.

And it's about inclusiveness, says the Prime Minister in an exclusive interview with Savai'i as a lead up to the first Cabinet meeting last week Wednesday at the new SNPF Office located at Salelologa.

The meeting is also in line with the Government's five year plan to provide the opportunity for all residents to have ownership of their fates by partnering with Government in the planning and implementation of projects which are developed based on their best interest and benefits.

For example, the Prime Minister cited the

For Amoa Resort Owner Paul Caffarelli and Resort Manager Elisabeth Siaosi the special gift presented by New Zealand's Governor General, her Excellency Rt. Honorable Dame Cindy Kiro is more than a royal recognition and honor. It has served notice to motivate Amoa Resort to uplift their standards and their services, facilities and hospitality to meet the high expectations of incoming guests.

From the menu, food, 4 star rooms and attentive services by the Resort Hotel, the Dame checked out and returned to New Zealand impressed.

Among the guests joining Dame Kiro included the Head of State, le Afioga i le Ao Mamalu ole Malo, le Afioga Tuimalealiifano Va'aletoa Sualauvi II, Council of Deputy le Afioga Tuiletufuga Le Mamea Ropati Mualia, Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa, Cabinet Ministers and Members of the Diplomatic Corp who attended the celebrations on the Big Island commemorating our 60th Independence Celebrations last week.

The royal recognition complemented with the guest list of high government dignitaries is the first time for a Savai'i resort and accommodation to be accorded accolades and recognition of this magnitude.

"To say it's an honor for Amoa Resort and our management and staff is an understatement," reacted a modest Caffarelli. "Her Excellency's gift has renewed our resolve to provide only the best services for our guests and as a service provider it is our duty to assist with the development of our tourism industry to Samoa especially to Savai'i."

Caffarelli is also singing Government praises acknowledging Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa and her Cabinet for taking the bold and tough call to re-open Samoa's borders effective August 1st.

"Live with COVID is a decision that we must all adjust and adopt to for the sake of our people," he added noting that during the COVID19 trying times, he struggled to keep his staff of 25 on the payroll. "They are a family and they have family to look after and we have weathered the toughest period since we started operations in 2015."

And Caffarelli applauds the Government's subsidy grants for the Tourism Industry which he describes as the "perfect post COVID19" assistance which he has reinvested to provide much needed maintenance for the Resorts' 23 room and villas with the bulking financing four new villas tentatively scheduled to be opened by the end of the year.

His investment is a strategic approach in anticipation of business picking up reflected by the high occupancy rate since the borders opened.

The majority of bookings between now and December are mostly Samoans abroad or VFR Samoans visiting families. "Our people overseas have been saving up to return home and check on families and we are here to accommodate," he added.

And while Tourism is coming alive on the Big Island, Caffarelli is urging his colleague to do their part with ensuring their resources rooms, menu and staff meets the public expectations.

"Here at Amoa, up skilling our staff to realize their full potentials complemented by sustaining our reputation as a four star accommodation provider is paramount," he said.

And Caffarelli is keeping a vigil that Government will be staging more events in the coming months for the sake of Savai'i tourism and hundreds of families relying on the industry for income for their survival.

Punialava'a Concert-A performance to remember

Punialava'a's Concert staged at Matagialua Friendship Park behind the Government Building Friday evening is a beacon of hope for better days uniting Samoans in harmony at the amphitheater and nearby lawns, a sight that hasn't been seen since the pandemic impacted the world including Samoa.

The last time that the Reclaimed Area at Eleele-Fou attracted this kind of shoulder to shoulder gathering was in 2001 when wrestling star and now Hollywood Superstar Seiuli the Rock Johnson came home to become a Samoan matai.

Back at Matagialua, Punialava'a captured the crowd and the people's hearts with their hit single, "Tagi le atunu'u pele" blasting a dynamite emotional response from the crowd joining in the chorus.

Members of the band, Rev. Iosefa Lale Peteru, Vini Nee Sofara, Nanai Lale Peteru, Vania Lale Peteru-Bunyali, Punialava'a Lale Peteru, and Melody Peteru touched the hearts of the crowd.

The lyrics speaks of the journey of the country from the measles epidemic that hit the population unexpectedly and claimed 83 lives in 2019 as well as the severity of the Covid-19 pandemic in 2020.

The song highlights Samoa as a nation founded on God, "Ua

ao Samoa le Atua o malama, Se'i fesili atu I Sa Levi ma Ositaulaga" translating The God of light has come to Samoa, and to stand in unity with the priesthood and clergy.

As the voices of the band travelled throughout the amphitheater, people of all ages looked up to the band singing at the top of their voices as Rev. Peteru walked down the stage swinging his hands ready to guide the crowds as they joined on in union.

As the song concluded the audience erupted into cheers displaying a nation coming out of recovery from an epidemic and a raging pandemic with the hope of a brighter and happier day ahead!

The band was first formed in the Samoan village of Vailele back in the 1960s by Reverend Iosefa Lale Peteru.

At the time he performed with his parents until 1968 when their first recording was made and then with friends.

The Reverend wrote and produced hit in the 1970s played on the Samoa National Broadcasting Service.

Although band members have changed over time the essence of their genre of music performed has stayed true to Samoa and Pacific history.

Today, the band is made up of the Reverend and his family; his wife Vini and their children.

Savai'i ancestral bond to NZ Maori

Savai'i has a particular significance to Maori, with some tribal tradition pointing to the big island as their ancestral home.

And the cultural and blood ties between Savai'i and the New Zealand Maori is an immortal bond connecting the Big Island to the Land of the Long White Cloud.

The sacred ties is one of the prides shared by New Zealand's Governor General Her Excellency Rt. Hon. Dame Cindy Kiro, a guest of honor invited by Government to attend the weeklong activities in Upolu and Savai'i to commemorate our 60th Independence anniversary.

And she was delighted to be part of this piece of Samoa's history.

During formalities of the Official Luncheon for the Celebrations of the 60th Anniversary of Samoa's Independence at Amoa Resort, she highlighted the six decades of friendship between New Zealand and Samoa pointing towards what the two countries have done for each other over the years.

"The bonds between our two countries underpinned by the Treaty of Friendship are enduring and robust.

Sixty years of diplomatic relations between

the two countries is emphasised by the motto "Uo Mamae" or "Lifelong friends" defines the relationship of Samoa and New Zealand she said.

Samoa's influence in Aotearoa is evident in the culture, sports, religious life, literature, arts, commerce, and education.

And, Aotearoa New Zealand has endeavored to play a positive role in Samoa's health and prosperity, most recently that included helping Samoa prepare for COVID-19.

"More than 180,000 New Zealanders can claim Samoan heritage. And Gagana Samoa is the third most widely spoken language in Aotearoa New Zealand, after English and Te Reo Maori."

Speaking to Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa, she said that in times of crisis the leadership and people of Samoa have shown what diligence, resilience, and cooperation can achieve.

She then presented a gift to Prime Minister Fiame, a Huia feather which she says is a mark of an outstanding bird of paradise.

Before that Her Excellency and her delegation had performed a Waiata, a Maori song, Purea Nei a song about the cleansing powers of rain, coming through tough times, and coming out of declivity.

World Champion Jai Opetaia, the face of Tourism

Jai Opetaia has not forgotten his supporters who have unselfishly helped realize his dream to become a world champion in professional boxing.

As the newly crowned IBF and Ring cruiser weight world champion, Opetaia is taking five in Samoa to personally thank his supporters including the Government of Samoa.

Four years ago, Opetaia with roots in Apia was appointed as Samoa's Roving Tourism Ambassador in the global squared arena in a partnership arrangement with the Samoa Tourism Authority.

To say thank you to Government and Samoa's support, Opetaia is in

the country for 2 weeks to recuperate after claiming his two world titles in July.

Opetaia who is in the country with Tasman Fighters a Management Promotional company for the boxing industry agreed to the partnership with a cool 'on to bigger and better things'.

A sign that his promotional efforts of Samoa is bringing in crowds and that he is enjoying every bit of the relationship.

Tourism Minister Toeolesulusulu thanked the Cruiserweight world champion for this support in promoting Samoa and congratulated him for his courage displayed at his most recent bout in the ring.

The Australian professional boxer, 27 was invited to travel into Samoa by the Minister and has worked closely with STA pre-covid to promote Samoa.

He has held the IBF and The Ring cruiserweight titles since July 2022. During his amateur days he won a bronze medal at the 2012 Youth World Championships and represented Australia at the 2012 Olympics and 2014 Commonwealth Games.

The meet reconfirms that he will continue to play this pivotal role for efforts to build the country's tourism industry following major impacts from Covid-19 that restricted international travel into the country.

Borders have recently re-opened on 1st August 2022 and with celebrations of the Independence in full swing and Opetaia attending many of these activities there has

been a huge following from the local community.

His presence in the country during the commemorations for the annual Teuila Festival linked in with Samoa's year-long 60th Independence celebrations has attracted crowds to the venues of celebratory activities he has attended.

While in Samoa Opetaia has also paid a call to Maluafo College and sailed to Savaii for the country's 60th Anniversary Independence commemorations a first ever hosted on the island.

These are scheduled visitations organized by the Tourism Authority while in Samoa.

Opetaia is also seen at many of these events making the time to shake hands and take photos and selfies with members of the community.

A perfect reflection of patience and humility often lost to many who have made it to the big leagues in other sports overseas.

STA Director Alise Stunnenberg recapped this when she addressed Opetaia during the meet. Echoing the amount of interest generated by the champion since his arrival into the country.

And encouraged that this relationship with STA in promoting Samoa would continue on to benefit both parties.

Toeolesulusulu in closing off the meeting shook hands with Opetaia and posed with photos of the boxing gloves of the champion worn at his recent win now on display in his office.

Savaii puts on spectacular independence show

Tuesday 06 of September will be forever etched into the history books as the first ever Independence celebration held on the Big Island since Samoa became the first Pacific Country to gain Independence in 1962.

As Samoa slides with faith into the future now that the state of emergency restrictions have recently lifted it has given opportunity for a fantastic display of patriotism for this year's 60th independence anniversary.

With no huge celebration in two years, Savaii started commemoratives with a bang as the first ever independence earmarked at the Don Bosco College grounds in Salelologa.

Attending the event; His Highness the Head of State of Samoa Tuimalealiifano Vaaletoa Sualauvi II, Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa, her Excellency the Rt Honorable Dame Cindy Kiro the Governor General of Aotearoa New Zealand, members of cabinet and the diplomatic corps.

We are indeed privileged with the presence of Her Excellency the Rt Honorable Dame Cindy Kiro – Governor General of Aotearoa New Zealand, and her husband – His Excellency Dr Davies and their delegation. We welcome Her Excellency as our Guest of Honor to the big island of Savai'i.

We have traversed rough seas and turbulence; as well as sailed the crests of our successes throughout our 60 year journey. We should never forget the tenacity, the visionary legacy drive and forbearance of our forefathers as well as past and present leaders to build Samoa to what it is today with the Lord's guidance and wisdom. As part of the celebrations in Savai'i, Cabinet has decided to hold its first Cabinet meeting in Savai'i this week. This is the foundation of new beginnings.

Let us continue to sail with faith and look upon our God and foundation to lead Samoa safely into the future.
