Tuimaleali'ifano re-appointed as Head of State

Before Parliament, as prescribed by the Constitution, the Head of State le Afioga I le Ao Mamalu o le Malo, le Afioga Tuimaleali'ifano Va'aleto'a Eti Sualauvi II took his oath to start his second term in office Tuesday this week.

His re-appointment was approved by Parliament on August 23rd.

Afioga Tuimaleali'ifano is the second to be appointed under Article 21 of the Constitution after Tui Atua Tupua Tamasese Efi in June 2007.

He served as a Member of the Council of Deputies to the Head of State from 1993 to 2004. He is a lawyer by profession, a former Public Trustee and also worked with the Attorney General's Office in the capacity of an Assistant Attorney General.

Opposition Leader and Secretary suspended for 2 years

In a secret ballot, Parliament this week approved the motion submitted by the Parliamentary Privileges and Ethics Committee, to suspend Members of Parliament Tuilaepa Dr. Sailele Malielegaoi and Lealailepule Rimoni Aiafi for 24 months effective immediately.

The suspension comes with no allowances or salary, no permittance of entry into Parliament and Parliament grounds, and the two MPs are not permitted to ask any members of the committee for clarification as to the decision or recommendation tabled.

The latest penalty comes on the heels of a 5-month suspension without pay sanctioned by Parliament against Tuilaepa Sailele Malielegaoi, who is the longest serving Prime Minister and incumbent Opposition Leader and

Inter-Samoa permit regime to end

The permit regime between Samoa and American Samoa is targeted for overhaul subject to the outcome of further negotiations between the American Samoa Government and her local counterparts.

This is one of the stipulations articulated in the Memorandum of Understanding inked by Governor Lemanu Peleti Mauga and Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa at the conclusion of bi-lateral talks during the Atoa o Samoa Executive Meeting in Apia last week Friday.

American Samoa has indicated that she will reinstate the 14 day entry permit for Samoans to travel to the territory to replace the 30 day permit starting in November.

They did not mention if the US\$40 fee charged for Immigration Sponsors in the territory to pay for local resident's entry permits will be exempted and this is deferred for further brainstorming between the officials from the two countries.

In addition, the current requirement for local residents to provide a medical and police report as part of the requirement to obtain the entry permit into the territory will be removed.

For Samoa, a fee \$20 tala permit fee is charged for American Samoan nationals.

But Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa has indicated that the local Government is prepared to reintroduce the law requirements for Open Access which grants 30 day entry permits on arrival for incoming travelers including American Samoa nationals free.

That however will depend on the outcome of further negotiations between the two Samoas.

On a related Immigration matter, the Guest Worker Permit by American Samoa exclusively for local residents to work at the Star Kist Samoa canneries in the territory also surfaced during the bi-lateral talks.

In the best interest of Samoa citizens fortunate to be recruited under the Guest Worker Permit, the local Government wants to formalize the recruitment on a Government to Government basis to replace the present direct hiring by Star Kist Samoa. This according to local government officials will guarantee that the rights and safety of Samoans hired by Star Kist are not compromised.

Suggestions for the territory's Guest Workers Permit to follow the New Zealand and Australian Seasonal Workers program is also an outstanding issue and it has also been deferred for further negotiations between the two governments.

On a related issue, American Samoa has also assured that come November the Talofa Pass requirement to returning residents and incoming travelers to the territory will be removed.

Other issues under the microscope during the talks include potential partnerships to benefit the two Samoas in the Education, Health, Tourism, Shipping, Law Enforcement, Transport Sectors. Etc.

American Samoa will host the next round of Atoa o Samoa talks next April to coincide with the territory's Flag Day Celebrations in line with the resolution by the two Governments for the Atoa o Samoa Executive Meeting to take place twice a year and not every 12 months.

Thank you Laulii: Police Commissioner

Commissioner of Police Auapaau Logotino Filipo has publicly acknowledged Laulii Village for helping police with their search for Lynn Nauer, who was on the run.

Nauer was arrested last Wednesday and remains under police custody on a holding charge of obtaining by deception, Commissioner Auapaau confirmed during a Press Conference.

The charges relate to complaints accusing the suspect of allegedly obtaining funds to process travel documents for Seasonal Jobs overseas.

On the run from the authorities when her alleged scam made the headlines, police took her into custody after authorities were alerted by Laulii Village where she was hiding.

According to the Police Commissioner eight complaints against Nauer filed with authorities remains under investigation with formal charges to be filed in Court when she appears for her Court mention scheduled for 25 October 2022.

Domestic Ports back with Ports Authority

The Management of both the Mulifanua and Salelologa domestic Wharves is back with the Samoa Ports Authority management.

In an exclusive interview with the Samoa Ports Authority (SPA) Chief Executive Officer (CEO) So'oalo Kuresa So'oalo told the Savali Newspaper the changeover went into effect 01 October this year.

But, So'oalo claims this isn't anything new since the wharves were originally managed by the Authority prior its transfer to the Samoa Shipping Corporation Limited (S.S.C.)

According to him the transfer back in 2014 was a result of an incident that he did not go into detail about.

"Well, the transfer back in 2014 it was based on an incident that occurred at that time and it was explained during that time but the wharves were under SPA."

But So'oalo however claims that the transfer was sudden and it happened with a 'bang'.

Thus, the management of the wharves have been under S.S.C. since then until the start of this month when a cabinet directive has made this an official return of the domestic ports to the authority's management.

"It is being carried forth now (transfer to SPA of wharves) and you reach here and I am finishing off documents for the change to the act," he said.

This will be provided to Cabinet in its next sitting of 18 October he explained.

"But it has started and we have taken over the ports."

According to So'oalo there was a decision from former Prime Minister Tuilaepa Dr Sailele Malielegaoi some time ago that was in the form of a letter to the previous CEO of S.S.C. that instructed the preparation of the wharves to be returned to SPA.

So, the transfer according to So'oalo isn't something that was unexpected. Rather a decision that was already considered.

But, confirmed that when the new Government came on board his chairman saw the opportunity for the transfer to be realised.

Thus, he was encouraged by his chairman to bring the wharves back under SPA and he had spoken with the Minister of Works,

Transport and Infrastructure (MWTI) regarding the matter.

When asked what the Authority has planned in respect to major developments for the Mulifanua and Salelologa Wharves So'oalo said it's still early days and a development plan for both facilities is in the pipeline.

He said SPA is also looking at ways to utilize the lands at the wharves.

When questioned what will become of the staff at these Ports So'oalo confirmed "no one will lose their jobs".

But, an official transfer of staff from SSC to SPA employment will be carried forth. The staff So'oalo refers to include the security officers and cleaners servicing the Mulifanua and Salelologa Wharves.

MV Lady Naomi fate uncertain: CEO SSC

The MV Lady Naomi service to the Samoa and American Samoa will come to an end next week, CEO of Samoa Shipping Corporation Limited (S.S.C) Leiataualetaua Captain Samuel Decca Phineas has confirmed.

The MV Lady Naomi has been in service for 24 years and due to wear and tear over the years compounded by increasing maintenance costs a replacement was in dire need.

The Government of Japan responded favorably to a request initiated by S.S.C. for financial support by approving funding of \$66.74 million under the ESDP grant aid assistance to build the new MV Lady Samoa IV to replace the aging MV Lady Naomi.

The new MV Lady Samoa IV is now heading to Samoa and tentatively scheduled to arrive on 27-28th October.

Onboard are 6 Samoan Crew members; 2 captains, 2 chief engineers, 1 electrician, and 1 workshop engineer.

The local crew who travelled over to Japan early this year for training in manning the vessel.

Assisting manning the new M.V. Lady Samoa IV on her maiden voyage home is also part and parcel of the training for hands on operational exposure for the Samoan crewmembers.

"MV Lady Samoa IV departed Setoda, Hiroshima Japan on the 08th October 2022," says Leiataua.

The replacement vessel was initially expected to arrive in Apia last August this year unfortunately due to safety variations that were



required it arrives next week.

According to Leiataua these safety variations were due to different regulations between the NKK classification and the US Coast Guard requirements.

"Yes, all the US Coast Guard requirements are now rectified," when asked to confirm.

The MV Lady Samoa IV is 48metres in length, boosts and international gross tonnage of 1,130 tons and capacity of 297 (280 passengers and

17 crew).

Meanwhile, the fate of the M.V. Lady Naomi is up in the air with the S.S.C. Board looking at options which is part of on-going engagement with Japan.

USP pursues Washington Accord accreditation

learning opportunities for students from the two Samoas.

The plan is for USP Samoa Campus to accept students from American Samoa to study at Alafua to pursue Engineering Degrees.

The proposed partnership according to officials is sanctioned under the Washington Accord an international agreement between bodies responsible for accrediting engineering degree programs.

The renewed engagement between the two Samoas is part of the outcome set down at the conclusion of the recent Atoa o Samoa Executive Meeting in Apia between the Government of Samoa and ASG.

Education, particularly in the field of Engineering was one of the main topics of a brief meeting between the USP Samoa Campus Director Tootooleaava Dr. Fanaafi Aiono-le-Tagaloa, Land Transport Authority (LTA) Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Galumalemana Titi Tuvanu Schwalger and Director of Education Afioga Talauega Dr. Samasoni Asaeli and delegates from the Utilities Sector in American Samoa and the Director of the Public Works Department.

Tootooleaava in an email responding to questions from Savali Newspaper stated the meeting was facilitated by the CEO of LTA (Samoa) Galumalemana Titi.

"I had mentioned to Galumalemana in a meeting we had on Thursday 6 October 2022 about opportunities for study for LTA Staff at USP – Samoa Campus, the hope to offer our American Samoan community the option of studying at USP – Samoa Campus especially for the Bachelor of Engineering (Mechanical, Electrical

and Civil)."

It was from this meet with the CEO of LTA that had led to Galumalemana mentioning the discussion with Tootooleaava to the Director of Education of American Samoa Afioga Talauega Dr Samasoni during the Atoa o Samoa Meeting where a delegation from American Samoa carried out site visits of infrastructural projects on island.

Tootooleaava said this led to the opportunity to meet.

"The Director of Education also invited to the meeting delegates from the Utilities Sector in American Samoa (Water and Power (ASPA) as well as the Director of the Public Works Department when we met on the evening of Tuesday 11 October 2022 at Taumeasina Island Resort," according to Tootooleaava.

"It was a brief meeting, no longer than an hour, but it was sufficient to outline the basics concerning the Bachelor of Engineering offered by USP and available for study from any of its 14 Campuses, at least for the 1st year of the Undergraduate Programme."

Adding that, "discussions with local professional bodies such as the Institute of Professional Engineers Samoa (IPES) and the Utilities Sector in American Samoa for example could look at the possibility and potential of bringing the teaching of the whole programme onsite at Samoa Campus".

But the discussions are in its early days and the initial contact will be with the Department of Education and the provision of basic information on the programme and other programmes offered at USP including Samoa Campus.

In terms of accreditation, the Campus Director stated that the Bachelor of Engineering – Mechanical, Electrical and Civil has been Accredited by the WASC Senior College and University Commission (WSCUC).

The WSCUC is recognized by the US Department of Education (USDE) and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA).

The Civil Engineering Discipline was the last of the three disciplines to be accredited by WSCUC, in 2021.

This year the USP School of Technology, Engineering, Mathematics and Physics (STEMP) is seeking accreditation of the programme under the Washington Accord which will mean it will also be considered equivalent to

the programme offered in NZ and Australia.

Tootooleaava also revealed that their brief meeting also brought forth initial discussions around pathways from High School in American Samoa to the undergraduate programmes of USP as well as from the American Samoa Community College (ASCC).

Tootooleaava also emphasized that it is the aim of USP to join other tertiary institutions in offering more options for our community.

"USP supports our shared work with NUS and other tertiary institutions as we encourage our population and community to seek further school and attain higher education," she said.

"This requires that we not duplicate options but create a real

range for our community to choose from, that fits with their individual considerations around work, family and income."

According to Tootooleaava, the ultimate aim is to grow Samoa's knowledge economy which determines the true wealth of a nation.

She added this was key as Samoa celebrates 60 years of Independence as we look ahead to what needs to be done to ensure tangible sustainable, self-sufficient development in all sectors especially Education, Health and Agriculture (Food Security).

MS Westerdam Cruise Ship initiates the return of tourists

Good news for Samoa the first cruise ship to grace our shores post covid has jump started the revival of the local tourism industry with the arrival of the MS Westerdam Tuesday this week with over 1,300 tourists mostly from Canada and the United States.

One more Cruise Ships is expected to arrive in October.

Confirmation came from Chief Executive Samoa Ports Authority So'alo Kuresa So'alo in an exclusive with Savali Newspaper yesterday morning.

"These ships booked [to travel here] during Covid era," he said. "[And] these are the first to arrive here since the end of the pandemic."

For the month of November, one Cruise Ship is confirmed but the advance bookings to be confirmed has reach 2025.

Excited about what this means for Samoa So'alo explained there is a committee for cruise ships consisting of; SPA, Samoa Tourism Authority (S.T.A), the private sector; tour agents and shipping companies and agents.

"And we are working together to welcome the arrival of the first cruise ship since the end of the pandemic."

He said the arrival of the ships brings about a great benefit to Samoa's economy.

"The spin-offs from the Cruise Ships and tourist translate to fresh revenue injected into the local economy, via taxi fares, tour operators and restaurants," he elaborated.

So'alo said just to consider when these passengers leave the ship they will be walking around, purchase handicrafts and food from the restaurants.

Also, SPA will also be leasing out spots on the wharf to handicraft sellers and other businesses under a tent that will be on the wharf.

But, So'alo claims this is for a very minimal price to cover the cost of the tent that will house these businesses and their products as they display their wares for sale for passengers from the cruise ship.

"This is the trickle effect of cruise ships," he said. "One 8 hour stop but there is a huge impact on tourism."

The local port agent for the vessels is Betham Brothers Enterprises.

And according to a pamphlet released from BEE they are excited to welcome back the first cruise ship since the MS Amsterdam called Apia in November 2019.

Since the Government of Samoa lifted all Covid-19 restrictions Carnival Corporation have wasted no time to include Apia on their Pacific Cruise itineraries for their subsidiaries Holland America, Princess Cruise Line and from 2023 P&O Cruises.

Owned by the Holland America Line the MS Westerdam is calling Apia on Tuesday



18th October at 0600hrs.

The MS Westerdam makes her maiden call to Apia, arriving from Kona, Hawaii. Her next port of call will be Suva, Fiji.

She brings with her 1392 passengers and over 35 different nationalities on board. The cruise began her journey on the 2nd of October departing from Seattle, Washington.

Margaret's Tours is the Shore Excursion

operator for the MS Westerdam. The Samoa Tourism Authority are preparing arrival entertainment, a string band as well as working with the Police Band to welcome back our first Cruise ship to our shores.

The Samoa Ports Authority will be organizing a Flea Market on the Port for the passengers and crew to enjoy.

It is expected that both authorities will

present commemorative plaques.

Master Wouter Hoogdalem is the Captain of MS Westerdam, leading a crew of 772.

The other two vessels arrived in Apia yesterday with the Maiden Call MS Zuiderdam (Holland America Line) and on Wednesday 23rd November MS Crown Princess (Princess Cruises).

Tourists galore in Apia

Samoa hosted 1,579 tourists complemented by Cruise Ship crew of 784 who arrived on Thursday morning via the MS Zuiderdam Cruise Ship.

It's the second injection of returning tourists to the island since our International Borders opened on August 1st 2022.

The next cruise ship, the MS Crown Princess, is scheduled to dock at the Matautu Wharf on Wednesday the 23rd of November.

With a lot of anticipation, the Matautu Wharf came to life earlier this month with the arrival MS Westerdam with 1,392 tourists the first gigantic group of international visitors to local

soils since the Borders Closed in March 2020.

The cruise ship, owned by Holland America Line, is the first to arrive in Samoa since 2019, and Captain Wouter Van Hoogdalem says it is fantastic to be the first.

"This ship has only sailed in Alaska and this is our first cruise outside of the United States and Canada," Captain Hoogdalem said in an interview.

The eager tourists were greeted by young Samoans performing various siva giving them a taste of what they will experience.

The Captain says that the arrival of the ship is a step forward during the pandemic, adding it is a great day for the industry and Samoa.

He explained that the 1,392 passengers are overjoyed to be in Samoa, revealing that he himself has been to Samoa twice, in 2008 and 2010.

Aside from tourism, the Captain added that there are now changes to the infrastructure to the port which he says are major improvements.

Captain Hoogdalem says he is looking forward to having lunch in Apia and is eager to try the local cuisine.

The Samoa Ports Authority (SPA) had also offered a flea market on the wharf where locals were able to sell handicrafts to the tourist.
