Aupito, New Zealand Minister of Pacific People stands down

Seasonal and veteran statesman Aupito William Sio is taking five from his public life as one of New Zealand's longest serving Member of Parliament complemented by his impeccable contribution as a Member and Deputy Mayor of Manukau, until further notice.

In an exclusive interview with Savai'i Newspaper on Tuesday afternoon Aupito brushed aside the term "retirement" for his not standing again for the seat this year.

"Well, I haven't used the word retirement, that's the NZ Media. What I have said is that I won't be standing again for the seat of Mangere, this year," he made clear.

Multiple Entry Visa to NZ proceeds: Aupito

New Zealand's Outgoing Minister for Pacific Peoples Aupito William Sio has confirmed Samoan government officials, diplomats and business people can now apply for multiple entry visas for up to 3 years to New Zealand.

Aupito confirmed this during an interview with the Savali Newspaper early this week where he said that it is "now open and you can apply".

"I think one of the things that we recently announced through our Minister of Immigration was making available multiply travel visas for Government representatives, diplomats, the Head of State and businesses."

He said this was announced late November 2021 and includes Samoa.

"The (NZ) Ministry of Immigration decided to make it available for Pacific Forum Members" after Samoa had voiced the initiative.


"But it was not initiated by Samoa as part of discussions while we were here to celebrate the 60th Anniversary of the treaty of friendships," said Aupito.

The NZ delegation travelled over specifically for this special commemoration that happened at the end of July last year.

"It's now open and you can apply for business multiple travel visa for up to 3 years and immigration have the discretion to make that work."

The Minister however acknowledged Samoa's Head of State le Afoga I le Ao Mamalu o le Malo, le Afoga Tuimaleali'iifano Va'aleto'a Eti who raised the matter during that visit and supported by the government ministers.

Aupito also dismissed rumors on the coconut wires labeling the Visa Free as a Labour Party election campaign citing that the initiative is a joint authentic move agreed upon by the two governments to recognize the Treaty of Friendship. With Samoa as the only Pacific Island to ink

a Treaty of Friendship with New Zealand, it is only fitting for visa free travel by Samoa to visit the Land of the Long White Cloud.

Aupito, New Zealand Minister of Pacific People stands down

After close to 15 years as a member of parliament for the New Zealand government, Aupito will not be contesting the Mangere seat for the 2023 elections.

The Minister for Pacific Peoples said that after 15 years under his belt come 1st April and almost 8 years as deputy Mayor of Manukau and a member of their council he walking away on his own terms and prepared to face the challenges ahead happily.

"It's 15 years in 1st of April, but when you consider I was also the deputy Mayor of Manukau and had been on the council of Manukau for almost 8 years, that is 22 years straight, no rest!"

Aupito is well known for his many achievements for the Pacific communities in New Zealand including his influence in the initiation of the formal apology by New Zealand Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern in 2021 at the City Hall where a traditional ifoga (apology) was conducted to express the Governments remorse on the Dawn Raid period in the 1970s that affected the people of Samoa and other Pacific islanders living in the country that time.

On a personal level, Aupito cited long unattended family commitments is the sole reason for stepping down this year.

While caucus wise, he has also informed Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern and he has provide the Prime Minister with options to remain active and serve the Pacific people and advocate for their wellbeing at the same time serving the Government of New Zealand.

"My wife reminded me the other day that our youngest son, of 7 children is 22 years and she said to me you've been absolutely useless in looking after our children...and I says yea," he chuckled.

The MP's retirement was announced by PM Ardern noting that from her government's 64 MPs six of them will retire including Aupito.

"Ministers Pito Williams, Aupito William Sio and David Clark will retire, along with MPs Jamie Strange, Marja Lubeck and Paul Eagle. All will stay in parliament until the election," she is quoted by the NZ Government's official website the Beehive on 13 December of last year.

She said the decisions come in the midst of Labour's selection process for seats in the 2023 elections and came at a fitting time to allow for the succession planning for both Cabinet and caucus.

Aupito told the Savali Newspaper that as the longest serving Pacific Member of Parliament, "There's a number of young and up-and-coming Pacific PMs that are there now and I am...I have got every confidence for them to step up and take the reins," he said.

"The other thing is I am very, very, proud of where I have taken matters around the Pacific in NZ."

He explained that he has overseen the growth and investment in the Pacific since 2010.

"Becoming a Minister, we've secured money every year since and in every budget since 2019 for Pacific targeted investment. We've made sure that funding is been continually grown and its now over \$70 hundred million targeted funding for Pacific in a number of portfolios," he added.

"I am also proud that we launched the All of Government Pacific Wellbeing strategy – and what that does is give the Minister for Pacific people who ever that maybe in future – a line across all portfolios."

He is currently the Chair of the Ministers All of Government Pacific Wellbeing.

But those are just a few of the works and achievements of Aupito who was born in Samoa in 1960 and migrated to New Zealand as a young boy nine years later.

When asked about his hand in the traditional ifoga in 2021 by NZ to Pacific people including Samoans involved in the Dawn Raid he said that was something he was very proud of.

"I was really proud and will be internally grateful to PM Ardern she had faith in my advice and accepted my advice when I said I would like to perform the ifoga."

He said PM Ardern did not quite understand what was happening but he had experience in the traditional Samoan ritual 'ifoga'.

"I've been involved in four ifogas [and] was quite comfortable with the performance and people involved lifting the mat."

The event was also a very personal one since his father was one of those who took part in the traditional ceremony and had aided in lifting the mat said the Minister.

"My father was dawn raided in 1972 and he represents all those elderly people who never spoke about how he felt and to this day but he was the Catholic President in Otara."

Aupito said all people not just Samoans were emotionally impacted by that era and events of the time.

"It wasn't just Samoan but all pacific people" and in 1974 racists and prejudice to brown people was something that occurred back then.

People were being dawn raided irrespective of whether they were New Zealand citizens or not said Aupito.

"First time ever that all these islands plus Maori came together and we weaved in, how to conduct a ceremony, the centre piece being the ifoga."

He said after the ifoga was done there was no need for anything else to be done but it was the first time ever that culture was displayed "in all its diversity where heads of government departments got to see this wasn't an act".

"This was us performing what we do. First time ever government accepted framework for gifting based on sua."

Aupito said this was a highlight for his career as Minister for Pacific Peoples.

"It's a stand-up moment of many moments as a minister for Pacific Peoples."

What's next Aupito said he doesn't want to interfere with the election campaign but whatever the party wants to do he has made himself available to the campaign manager.

"But, I'm actually quite relaxed about it and I feel free. I said to the pacific caucus, I am handing over the responsibility to you all and now I'm going to hold you accountable."

"Māngere will make it's confirm candidate Lemauga Lydia Sosene she is already a list MP," he said.

"Everything is set but I have not finalised anything for final steps for a number of things in front of me."

He returns to New Zealand this Saturday.

For clarify, the awards are design to recognize the for brave Samoans who have performed


lifesaving acts during times of natural disasters, emergencies and health pandemics which had threatened the lives of residents and loved one, explained Agafili.

SSC met with a busy festive season

It has not been smooth sailing for the Samoa Shipping Corporation during the Christmas and New Year festive season even though it was ritually their busiest and biggest money earner for the year.

While the actual revenues collected is tallied and should make available in the coming weeks, (S.S.C.) Limited General Manager Leiataua Captain Samuel Decca Phineas admits that while it was rather hectic meeting the high transportation demand, there were also setbacks encountered.

According to the General Manager the influx of passengers might have been a huge welcome for the financial standing of the corporation but not with hiccups which included poor weather compounded by vessel repairs and maintenance.

"Financial accounts for December are not yet finalised which provides figures so to know the exact number of the travelling public between the 2 islands, but I can confirm that the travelling community this year is quite high compared to previous years."

He said the demand was highly reflective in the additional trips the Corporation had to initiate different from their normal schedule towards Christmas and the New Year.

On overly busy days, the Corporation resorted to ten sailings a day, five each for the two interisland ferries sailing to Salelologa and back to Mulifanua to cater for the travelling public.

"An additional vessel was also deployed to assist the two large vessels servicing the domestic route," he said.

The vessels in operation during the festive season were the MV Lady Samoa III and the MV Samoa Express II, with the SSC Fasefulu called in to provide assistance.

With the weather conditions worsening over time during the festive season Leiataua they had to cancel scheduled sailings.

Although the corporation managed to cater to the demand including those who had already booked but were unable to travel due to cancellations by injecting additional trips this did not ease the queues of vehicles at the terminals.

"One additional trip for both vessels were added in most of the days with five trips for MV Lady Samoa III on some days if stand-by vehicle number increase," said Leiataua.

In terms of repairs, the General-Manager revealed that the MV Samoa Express II was out of service for a week during the festive season due to a mechanical breakdown on the port engine.

"Spare parts were air freighted from New Zealand and our technical team were working throughout the Christmas holidays to perform repair works for the vessel. The MV Samoa Express II was back in service before New Year's," he said.

For the Apia-Pago Pago route, Leiataua stated that exact number of travelers are not available but confirmed that there was an increase in the number of the returning Samoans including seasonal workers for Star Kist, with volume of cargo also experiencing an increase.

Police keeps vigil on more recruitment

Commissioner of Police Auapau Logoitino Filipo is keeping vigil for the Public Service Commission (P.S.C.) to reconsider and reinstate the hiring of permanent staff as Officers and Principal

The announcement was made in the official Public Service Commission circulate dated 23 December 2022.

"In accordance with the Public Service Commission's circular memorandum #17 of 16 December 2022, the advertisement of permanent vacancies (from Officer to Principal level) listed below is cancelled until further notice".

A sub notice stated that this involves 40 constables and 15 correction officer positions advertised by the Ministry.

In an exclusive interview with Savali Newspaper, Auapau said his Ministry is awaiting a response from P.S.C regarding this matter.

"We have reached out to P.S.C. if we are affected," he said.

Nearly 200 people have applied for the roles advertised, they are going through the vetting, but Auapau says they are awaiting clearance from the P.S.C. to move forward.

The Ministry's target workforce is 1021 currently short by a little over 100.

He explained they are looking to fulfill the required amount as the manpower is needed for next year's Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) to be hosted in Samoa in 2024 and is expected to bring over 50 heads of Government that are member countries to the Commonwealth.

According to China's Daily, China's Beijing has initiated renewed COVID-19 response

designed to strengthen the protection, security and safety with the paramount objective to minimize fatalities.

Part of the renewed approached is spelled out in millions of dollars invested by China to build new hospitals and recruit more health professionals and health care provide to

response to any second wave of the virus and slowly eradicate COVID from China.

According to the World Meter, as of January 10th 2023, China has 118,977 active cases with 5,227 deaths from COVID-19 since the pandemic made her unwelcomed presence on the world stage.
