Nafanua II replacement arrives in January

The long-awaited arrival of the Nafanua II replacement is scheduled to arrive into Samoa's shores in early 2024, the commissioner of Police has confirmed.

Commissioner Auapaau Logoitino Filipo made the announcement at the launch of the 'Tilafaiga' Patrol Boat fully funded by Japan under its Economic and Social Development Programme to Samoa on Tuesday afternoon.

According to Auapaau a crew has already been selected and will be travelling to Australia in September to attend trainings and prepare to bring the guardian-class patrol boat to Apia.

A handover ceremony is also planned for November in Australia before the crew of 23 Samoans sail to Apia and are scheduled to arrive in Samoa in January 2024.

A captain for the replacement vessel has also been chosen said the commissioner. A name was not quickly revealed however.

BACKGROUND

The Nafanua II ran aground on a reef in Salelologa in 2021. However, it could not be repaired and the damaged vessel was salvaged and sent back to Australia.

Her placement was announced last year by Australia's Foreign Minister Penny Wong during her visit to Samoa.

The new Guardian-class patrol boat is being built in Australia and will be protecting Samoa's maritime together with the recently launched Tilafaiga Patrol Boat from the Government of Japan.

Parliament approves transfer of Licensing and Registration back to LTA

It is official, the Licensing and Registrations of vehicles is now transferred back under the management of the Land Transport Authority from the Samoa Police.

This comes after Parliament passed the Miscellaneous (Principal Licensing Authority) Amendment Bill 2023 debated in Parliament over the past few days.

The Bill also sought to clarify various functions under the various legislations relating to licensing and registration of vehicles.

Minister of Police, Faualo Harry Jeffrey Schuster told Parliament at the introduction of the Bill that four Acts: The Land Transport Authority Act 2007; Police Powers Act 2007; Road Traffic (Payment of Fines) Act 2009; Road Traffic Ordinance 1960 were involved under the Bill.

According to Faualo the transferal back of these services to LTA was necessary because the licensing and registration of vehicles were unrelated to the duties and functions of the Samoa Police.

The Polices' main duties and responsibilities were; the enforcement of the law, safeguarding of government assets, private properties of the general public and safety of the people of Samoa and reducing criminal offenses.

Tui Atua Tupua Tamasese, the first of his kind

A former Head of State, Tui Atua Tupua Tamasese Efi is the first Samoan to have served in constitutional roles starting with:

- A Member of Parliament
- Prime Minister
- Council of Deputies
- Head of State

And his services are recognized receiving the Order of Samoa Award this year during the Governments Honour and Awards Event on May 31st to conclude the yearlong 60th Independence Festivities.

An author in his own right Tui Atua, 85 was born 01 March 1938 and educated at Marist Brothers School, St Patrick's College (Silverstream, Wellington, NZ) and Victoria University, Wellington, New Zealand.

Fifty-one years of his life was dedicated to serve his constituencies and people of Samoa, his professional career in politics spanning from 1966 to 2017.

A well-respected member of society, Tui Atua served as; Member of Parliament for Vaisigano No.1 from 1966 to 1968, Aana Alofi No.2 from 1970 to 1978, Anoomaa East from 1980 to 1987.

He was appointed Minister of Works from 1973 until 1975 and elected Prime Minister from 1976 to 1982.

Tui Atua was Deputy Prime Minister from 1985 until 1988. The same year his tenure as PM ended, he became Leader of the Opposition Party until 2004.

As holder of the maximal lineage Tama-a-'aiga title of Tupua Tamasese, one of the four paramount chiefs of Samoa, and holder of the

royal pāpā title of Tui Atua he was a Member of the Council of Deputies from 2004 to 2007 until he was sworn in at Samoa's Parliament in June 2007 as Head of State.

Tui Atua was Afioga I le Ao Mamalu o le Malo from 2007 to 2012 and for a second time from 2012 to 2017.

He has also served various distinguished posts in Government. From 1987 to 1991 he served as Commissioner for the South Commission Headquartered in Geneva.

Was PhD examiner of Samoan and Pacific History at the Australian National University, in Canberra 1991.

Held the position of Resident Scholar for Pacific Studies Centre for the Australian National University in 1991, and was also, Adjunct Professor for Awanuiorangi in New Zealand.

Tui Atua in 2005 was Associate Member of the Matahauariki Institute, and also served that same year at the Waikato University.

He also served as the Oceania Representative in the Pontifical Interreligious Dialogue Commission (2005).

Two years later in March 2008 until December 2013 His Highness was Chancellor of the National University of Samoa.

Tui Atua's service in academics in Samoa however continued through the years. He was strategic Advisor for the Ministry of Education, Sports and Culture (MESOC) under an AusAid Program to support the implementation of the Education Sector Project 2, including the Tracer study among many other prestigious positions.

A man of God and Musician

Methodist Church Minister (Faifeau Malolo Manumalo) Rev. Tupu Folasia II is one of four recipients honoured with the Order of Merit from the Government of Samoa for his long-standing service to the country through his contribution to education and music.

The 80 -year-old from Tulaele taught from 1971 to 1975 at Ueseliana College in Satupaitea, Savaii and then at George Brown at Faleula from 1975 to 1976.

He was later appointed Principal in 1976 to Ueseliana.

While serving as a teacher at the Ueseliana College, Rev. Tupu also aided the Methodist church choir as well as offered his help to teach the youth music, especially piano.

Today, many of those youths are composers in many of the choirs in churches across the country as well as Satupaitea.

The Reverend was also head of the Komiti o le Tusi Pese and transcribed Methodist hymns to music notations and was behind various initiatives that led to the establishment of the Sagone Brass Band.

During this time in the Reverend's service, he aided the youth of Sagone by gaining support from the Alii and Faipule by urging youths to engage more in working the plantations before committing to any sporting activities.

At the time the Reverend was appointed to serve as Minister for the church at Sagone, where he was secretary of Savaii West Synod spanning from Asau to Salailua.

He served in this capacity from the early 80's until 1990.

At the time the cheapest band equipment needed for the group could only be purchased from Taiwan.

And, the King of Tonga was a shareholder of the Taiwan company, so Rev. Tupu travelled over especially for consultations in order for the youth to purchase the equipment.

Because of that initiative by the reverend, things started to fall into place for the youth and not long, the Sagone Brass Band was born.

The band has won several Independence competitions over the many years since its establishment and have toured the whole of Savaii.

The Sagone Brass Band however has done more than just bring enlightenment through entertainments to the people.

Thanks to their support towards long term developments for Sagone, the group helped fund the reconstruction of the Secondary school of Sagone, for a fence and for the construction of the Reverends' house.

Following his final teaching year at George Brown, Rev. Tupu was appointed Principal of Ueseliana.

He continued to be called to be part of various developments in music over the years including in 1977 when he was called to join Ueta Solomona in participating at the Pacific Musical Practicum that also involved music teachers from America, Australia, New Zealand and Fiji.

In 1990 he was called again to look after the church at Satapuala, and it was during this period of his religious calling that the reverend due to the absence of church ministers serving the Congregational Christian church (CCCS), a Deacon for the Catholic Church, Rev. Tupu serviced all three churches.

It was this initiative by the reverend which aided tremendously in uniting the villagers.

Rev. Tupu was then appointed to oversee the Matafele Church in 1997 and at the time water issues had plagued the congregation.

That soon became resolved when a tank was established on the property of the church to ensure that water problems were no longer an affliction for the congregational members.

In 2004 the reverend's religious counsel and service was required at Lufilufi. It was during this time that Rev. Tupu was appointed to the

position of Secretary of the Methodist Church Samoa, and eventually to President of the Church, before his retirement in 2012.

He is married to Faletua Alaimalo and they have three children; one is currently serving as Church Minister at the Methodist Church

of Salailua, while the other is teaching at Piula Theological college and the only daughter works for the Samoa National Provident Fund.

Reverend Tupu Folasia II entered Piula Theological College in 1960 and graduated in 1964.

'Tilafaiga' Patrol Boat launched

A \$1.5 million tala patrol boat for the Maritime Division of the Samoa Police will boost Samoa's security after "Tilafaiga" was officially launched on Tuesday afternoon at the Matautu-tai Wharf.

Funded by the Government of Japan under Japan's Economic and Social Development Programme, Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa as keynote speaker at the event said the vessel will help address the country's patrolling and surveillance requirements.

'Tilafaiga' comes fully fitted and with the project funding additional accessories (prefabricated pontoon), a 5-day Operation and Maintenance Training service and installation service by the Japanese contractors the Prime Minister added.

She stressed 'Tilafaiga' will be a valuable asset to help protect and keep Samoa safe and respond to Search and Rescue emergencies.

And, meanwhile while expecting a replacement vessel for Nafanua

II to arrive in early 2024, the Samoan Government and the Ministry of Police in particular acknowledge with gratitude the opportunity to have another vessel to assist with maritime surveillance activities.

Fiame said, the ongoing support provided by Japan as one of the key development partners, is testimony of the continuous close relations and the genuine partnership between the two countries.

"May, 'Tilafaiga' weathers the elements of our tempestuous Pacific Ocean and the risks and threats of maritime operations."

The 17-meter-long boat handed over signifies a boost in relationship between the two countries Ambassador of Japan to Samoa Keisuke Senta attested the Prime Ministers earlier musings of the agreement that has materialised with the launch of the boat.

The arrival of the boat further protects Samoa's maritime and he looks forward to the boost in security with the arrival of the Australian funded Nafanua III in the near future.

The ambassador finished off his speech with, "Folau ma le fa'atuatua".

Transport and Infrastructure Sector Plan launched

The Transport and Infrastructure Sector Plan 2023 – 2028 is now officially launched.

The long-term priority goals and programs to achieve them for both the Transport and Infrastructure sectors in Samoa operating under the Ministry of Works, Transport and Infrastructure (MWTI) outlines programs to be executed over a period of five years.

Launched at the Tanoa Hotel on Thursday, MWTI Minister Olo Fiti Vaai in his keynote address said the ministry's goal is simple: to ensure the Sector's direction aligns with the National Plan or the 'Pathway for the Development of Samoa'.

"We believe that assurance of connectivity, accessibility and resilience is the key to empowering communities, building resilience, and inspiring growth to elevate the quality of life for all ensuring no one is left behind," said the minister.

So, the plan, he further explained, reflects the transport and infrastructure sector's commitment for the next five years and preparations for the advancement of the same services in future years.

According to Olo, physical works and initiatives are scheduled for implementation, several studies are being commissioned to inform future infrastructural developments, to strengthen the Sector's capacity and determine a business outlook in support of the nation's economy.

The development of the plan is something the ministry is proud of. The plan was developed by the collaborative efforts of Ministries, Corporations, private sector, communities, development partners and stakeholders.

"It is the first time we have formulated a Plan of this magnitude, without the assistance of an overseas consultant," said Olo.

"When overseas consultants are brought in for these purposes, we ask "why?" We are always told, it's because they are "experts". And so we ask again, What about us? Well,

the Transport and Infrastructure Sector has answered that question for you today - We are all experts."

The minister is also confident the implementation will be faced with challenges however, he believes Samoa has come a long way and so have the stakeholders.

And are well prepared and ready to address these issues, "as government officials, the private sector, communities and development partners have worked endlessly for years in serving our Samoa".

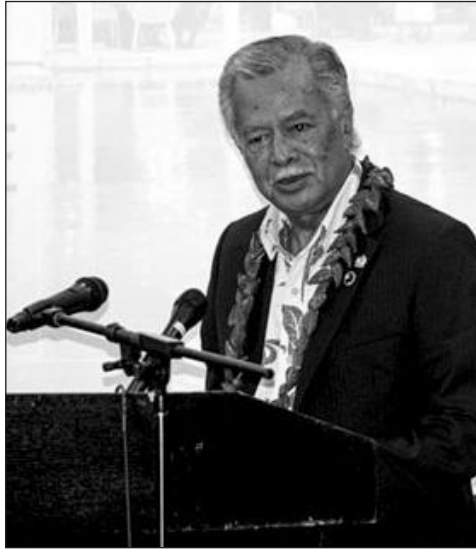

Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa at the recent trip of Secretary-General of the Pacific Islands Forum (PIF) to Samoa acknowledged his hardwork as he heads into his last year of tenure.

The head of PIF, Henry Puna was in the country last week.

PM Fiame said his service to the Pacific region has been greatly appreciated by the Samoan Government.

"I wish to extend my Government and I's deep appreciation for your leadership of the work of our Organisation, and your advice to us as Leaders on the plethora of regional priority issues and concerns faced by our countries," she said.

The Prime Minister also thanked Mr. Puna for his continued support and assistance accorded by his Offices to the Government of Samoa, which have continued to build excellent relations and work that exist between PIF and Samoa.

As former Prime Minister of Cook Islands, Mr. Puna served for a decade in this capacity, he knows overwhelming pressures that comes with such a high-profile job.

U.S. steps in to assist Rhinoceros Beetle control

The Coconut Rhinoceros Beetle continues to be an unwanted pest in the country causing harm to the coconut trees, and the U.S. Agency for International Development's (USAID) Pacific American Fund have, swooped in to boost control and manage the problem.

The grant of USD\$997,564 will go towards a joint effort by the Women in Business Development Inc (WIBDI) in partnership with the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries (MAF).

Speaking during the launch of the project, Minister of Natural Resources and Environment (MNRE) Toeolesulusulu Cedric Schuster who delivered the keynote address at the event said, there have been numerous programmes spearheaded by MAF to eradicate the Coconut Rhinoceros Beetle.

However, the minister explained this joint initiative between WIBDI and MAF draws upon collective means involving the community.

"The new programme by WIBDI will certainly help the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries with extra hands to spread the message and implement actions by having more of our community involved."

The Minister says eradicating the Coconut Rhinoceros Beetle is vital because it damages coconut trees.

These trees are not just useful for various purposes for the community but is also the backbone of economic development.

Minister Toeolesulusulu was invited to carry out the keynote address as Minister and Associate ministers of Agriculture and Fisheries were unavailable due to the scheduled Uluai Seleselega at Salelologa that was underway that day, thus he was requested then by WIBDI to

represent the government at the event.

The linkage to the Minister of MNRE's ministry is they coordinate the implementation of the National Invasive Species Strategy and Action Plan NISSAP of which the rhinoceros beetle is one of the most prolific in the country.

THE PROGRAM

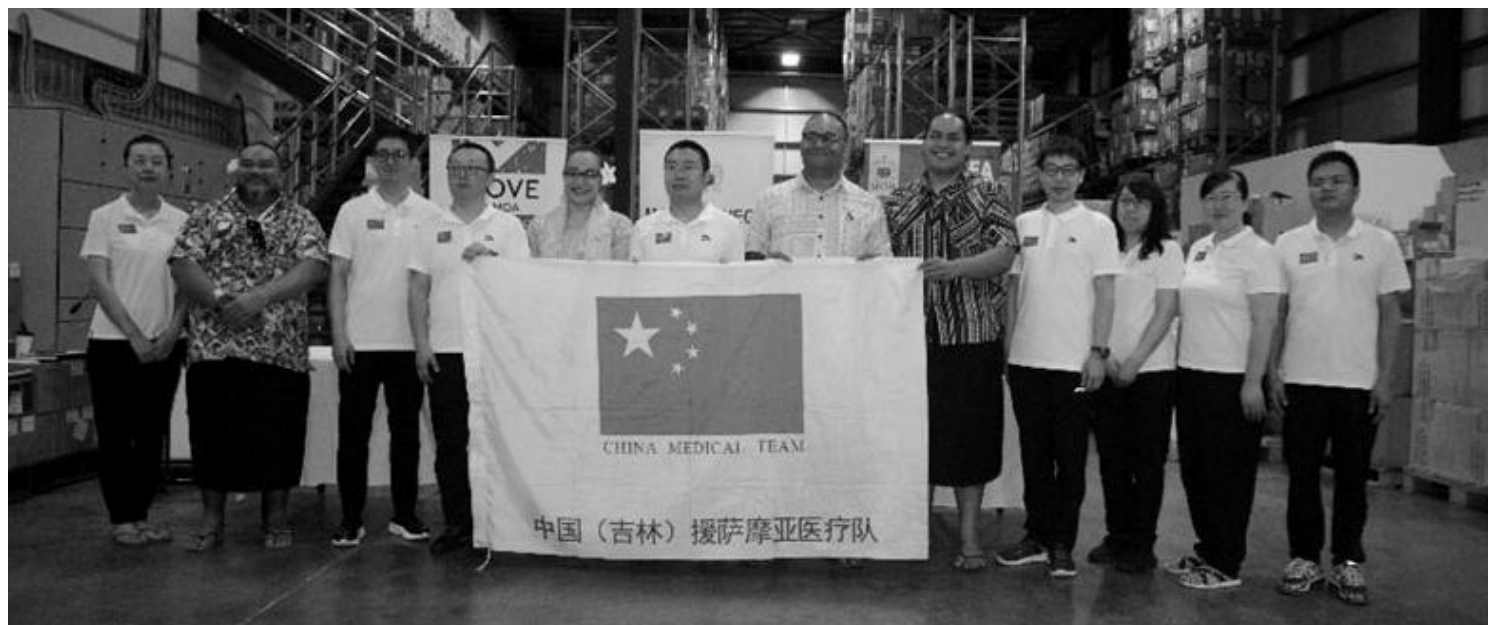
WIBDI, MAF, and USAID will work together with 2,000 small scale farmers to implement an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) program across impacted villages.

Using natural biological control agents, pheromone traps, and improved sanitation methods, farmers will learn how to combat the Coconut Rhinoceros Beetle without chemicals or pesticides.

And a critical component for the project is building resilience of the coconut plantations to climate change and natural disasters.

Seuula stressed that if records of today are safeguarded, there is no doubt Samoa's history will be clear and complete to be understood in the future.

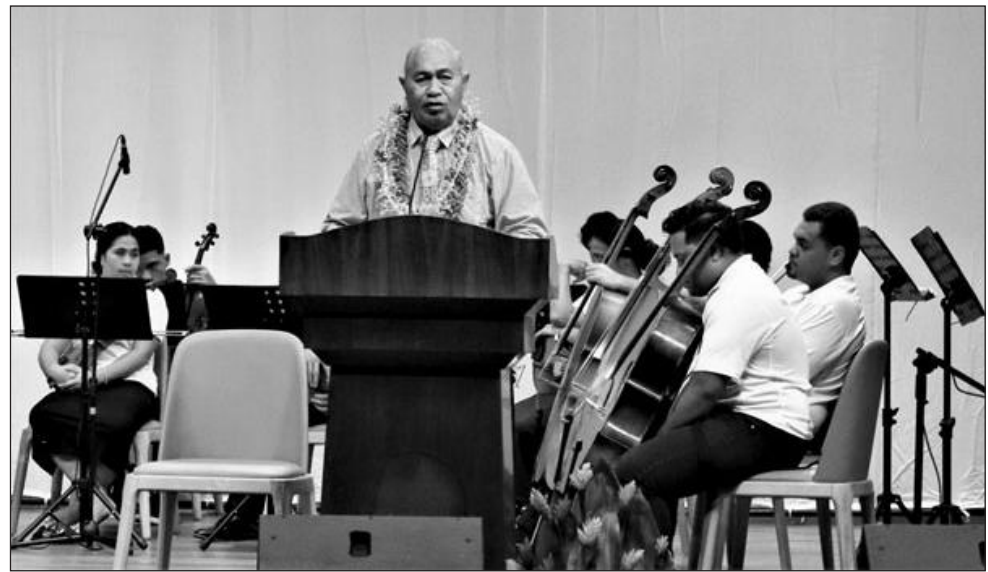
Promote, preserve and safeguard our heritage he stressed.

Parliament approves transfer of Licensing and Registration back to LTA

The licensing and registrations of vehicles was unrelated completely to these functions and this was mainly why these amendments were being sought.

The majority of Members of Parliament that rose to express their views were mainly for the transfer of the licensing and registration of vehicles back to LTA.

Many cited that LTA was initially the authority that had overseen these services before it was transferred to the Samoa Police during the time of the Human Rights Protection Party' so it was only appropriate.

They also noted various suggestions to improving the amendments.

These include;

- The enforcement of reducing music blasting from taxi, bus and private vehicles,
- Outsourcing of vehicle registrations to qualified mechanics,
- Speed limitations from slow to fast (vice-versa) to address traffic congestions and accidents,
- Vehicle insurance aid in traffic incidents that involve damages to vehicles,
- Defensive driving courses and a driving school,
- School crossings, signals, reflectors
- Reducing registration fees,
- Learners' licenses,
- Setting up eye and hearing tests as part of drivers license requirements
- Improvement on the exams for driver's license eligibility
- Protection of consumer rights for purchasing vehicles
- Establishment of a pedestal high enough to protect police officers responsible for

directing traffic

- Drivers to fully understand parking areas for vehicles and who should enforce or direct these
- A 1-year ban on vehicle importation to address increase in vehicles in country and reducing traffic accidents,
- Enforcement on Car dealers to bring in car parts for vehicles to ensure that cars are not being left standing without being repaired (causing harm to environment) among other issues.

Minister of Works, Transport and Infrastructure Olo Fiti Vaai assured that all suggestions relating to the LTA were very important and announced various developments the authority will and has already been looking into for addressing these very concerns and suggestions.

Opposition leader Fonote Luafesili Pierre Laufo said the Bill is very important and all areas pertaining to enforcement and application was essential and had to be in place.

Faulo noted that two important matters were very noticeable in suggestions and concerns raised by the members of parliament.

These were safety and licensing of drivers and their understanding of the law to ensure protection of drivers, pedestrians and especially students using the roads.

The second matter was the enforcement of the law and ensuring the application of the law in relation to modification of vehicle parts such as; additional equipment installed in vehicles that were not initially brought with the vehicle such as horns, UV lights and loud music from cars.

He noted that Police will enforce the law to remove modified equipment installed in commercial vehicles such as buses and taxis and private vehicles.

Tusanilefaiaao honored with a Companion of the Order of Samoa Award

The Government through Samoa's Honours and Awards Investiture has awarded Tusanilefaiaao Iosefatu Reti a Companion of the Order of Samoa Award.

The Companion of the Order of Samoa Award is also known as the II Class Order of Samoa.

It is conferred upon Samoan citizens, or foreigners as an Honorary Award, in recognition of important national or international contributions made to the people, life, or culture of Samoa.

Tusanilefaiaao Iosefatu Reti is 77 years old and is from the villages of Savaia Lefaga and Siusega.

Tusanilefaiaao has served for 40 plus years in various capacities in the areas of the Forestry, Pacific Regional Environment, Environment Agency for Samoa and the South Pacific Biodiversity Conservation, for Samoa and the Pacific.

He was the first Samoan to become a Coordinator for the Secretariat of the Pacific Regional Environment Programme (S.P.R.E.P.) and wrote a paper on the future of S.P.R.E.P., to become an organization separate from the South Pacific Commission (S.P.C.).

Negotiated together with Mr. Kilifoti Eteuati, the establishment of the first S.P.R.E.P office in Samoa and the Pacific, and won the bid for Samoa.

In 2017, Tusanilefaiaao also received an award for his contribution in the Agricultural Sector in Samoa.

Some of Tusanilefaiaao's efforts and services also benefited the people of Savaia Lefaga as well.

He was one of the Committee members who led the first Talamua to take place in Samoa, which was conducted in Savaia Lefaga.

Tusanilefaiaao is currently work as an Advisor and Consultant for Environment and Conservation.

Mention the name Asi Blakelock and the first thing that pops up in your mind Police.

Asi Tuiataga Semisi James Blakelock during his tenure as Police Commissioner was the most feared.

No one was and is above the law is the uncompromising principal which made Asi a Commissioner of Police in his own class.

And it's most fitting for the Government's Honors Committee to recognize Asi's 60-year service as an Officer of the Peace with the Companion of the Order of Samoa Award.

Presented to the retired law enforcer during the Governments Honour and Awards 2023 on May 31st to end the yearlong 60th Independence Celebrations, Asi started his public service in 1962, the same year that Samoa gained Independence.

From Police Constable, to Police Sergeant, Senior Sergeant, Inspector, Chief Inspector and eventually Police Commissioner, Asi dedicated

41 years of his life to maintain law, order and peace in Samoa.

Throughout his career, Asi has had extensive training in New Zealand and was a sworn in officer with the New Zealand Police.

He entered the history books by orchestrating the first Police Peace Keeping Force Mission of 45 officers to East Timor.

Today, the Samoa Police Peace Keeping Missions have benefitted the force and officers gaining valuable ground experience complimented by lucrative incomes.

Retiring from the force, he continued as a diplomat for his country as Samoa's High Commissioner to New Zealand for a decade.

Incidentally the 85-year-old from the villages of Moataa and Ululoloa is a former committee member for the Samoa Honours and Awards in 2017.

In his youth, Mr. Asi Blakelock enjoyed playing rugby and cricket. He also enjoys reading and listening to gospel or country music, and he walks to stay active.

Palanitina-the discreet achiever

Serving one's country is an honour many dedicate their lives to, and for almost half a century Palanitina Tupuimatagi Toelupe has served Samoa with pride in the nation's health sector.

And her service has been recognized by Government, awarding her the Companion of the Order of Samoa.

Before her long service in Samoa's health sector, the 68-year-old who hails from Faletagaloa Safune, Vailele, Vailoa, and Malie started her academic journey at Itu o Tane and Itu Asau from 1967 to 1968 before moving on to Leififi Intermediate School from 1969 to 1971.

In 1971, she became a student of one of Samoa's top schools - Samoa College until graduating in 1974.

She was then blessed with a scholarship to study in New Zealand at the Rotorua Public Hospital School of Nursing from 1975 to 1978.

In the years that followed, Palanitina continued to be blessed with opportunities to further her studies in educational institutions such as the Victoria College Burnwood Campus (Deakin University), National University of Samoa (NUS), University of New South Wales, University of New England, and Boston University.

She started her service to her country working as a Registered Nurse in 1979 at the Intensive Care Unit of the Tupua Tamasese Meaole Hospital at Motootua.

Palanitina then moved on to become a Nurse Educator in 1981 at the Department of Health School of Nursing in the nation's

university.

She continued her service as an educator from 1982 to 1998 in which during the time she moved up to the senior ranks and eventually Chief of Health Educator and Health Promotion Specialist.

In October 1998, the longtime serving nurse switched from Health to the Ministry of Women, Community, and Social Development (MWCSO) taking on the role of Assistant Secretary for 5 years and then taking on the Assistant Chief Executive Officer role in the Ministry from 2003 to 2005.

By February 2005, Palanitina made a comeback in health to lead the Ministry of Health as its Director General for nine years.

After her long service to the Health Ministry, she was chosen as the Chairperson of the Samoa Qualifications Authority Board of Directors - Education Sector in 2016.

She once again made a comeback in health in leading the National Health Services as the General Manager from 2016 to 2019.

In the years that followed, she was part of the Board of Directors of the Samoa Water Authority (SWA), and to this day is part of the Board of Directors of the Land Transport Authority (LTA).

While she was dedicating her life in service of her country, Palanitina was also took on roles such as a Court Assessor, serving her church Vailele Congregational Christian Church of Samoa (CCCS) as a Member of the Mafutaga o Tina, Church Secretary, and the Matagaluega Apia Sasae Deacon/ Representative to the CCCS Komiti o Feau Eeseese.

Asuao Williams honoured for his bravery

Asuao Taalili Williams has saved many lives and minimised property damages avoiding family miseries throughout his career as a fire fighter and Commissioner of Fire Services for 10 years.

No one can forget the disastrous fire which gutted the historical Tivoli Theatre in 1981 on August 6th.

Instead of saving the theatre, Asuao as Commissioner ordered his team to contain the flames from spreading to neighboring families. And it was a success. Not a single home was gutted by fire.

The Samoa Post Office fire which threatened a neighboring family business. Commissioner Asuao placed himself in harm's way to save the property. To acknowledge Asuao and the Fire Services, the family gifted them with \$25,000.

Asuao also saved the day in 1983 while Samoa hosted the South Games. The fire at one of the warehouses at the wharf converted into a sports facility had threatened the athletes and spectators.

The threatening flames were diminished with no casualties and competition resuming without any further disruptions.

These are just a few of the highlights during Asuao's career.

Hailing from Letava, Vaoala and Siumu and the 78 years old Asuao started his career life with the Air New Zealand Company in 1966. He later served at New Zealand's Fire and Emergency Services Organization from 1973 to 1974. He has also served the U.S. Navy at Vietnam (active war) for 5 years.

Asuao was appointed as Samoa's Commissioner for the Fire and Emergency Services Authority in 1980 and served 10 years. He was known for his bravery and heart in serving his country through many emergencies in Samoa and lives he saved.

He is a man who serves his village, church and district and also made significant contributions to the betterment of his people.

He developed a farm in Siumu, where many people from neighboring villages worked. This firm produced boxes of taro and pasio for export and was a good source of income for him and his family.

Leading the district march and blocking the road to Tiavi in order for the government to return the lands owned by its people was also one of the milestones in Asuao's life.

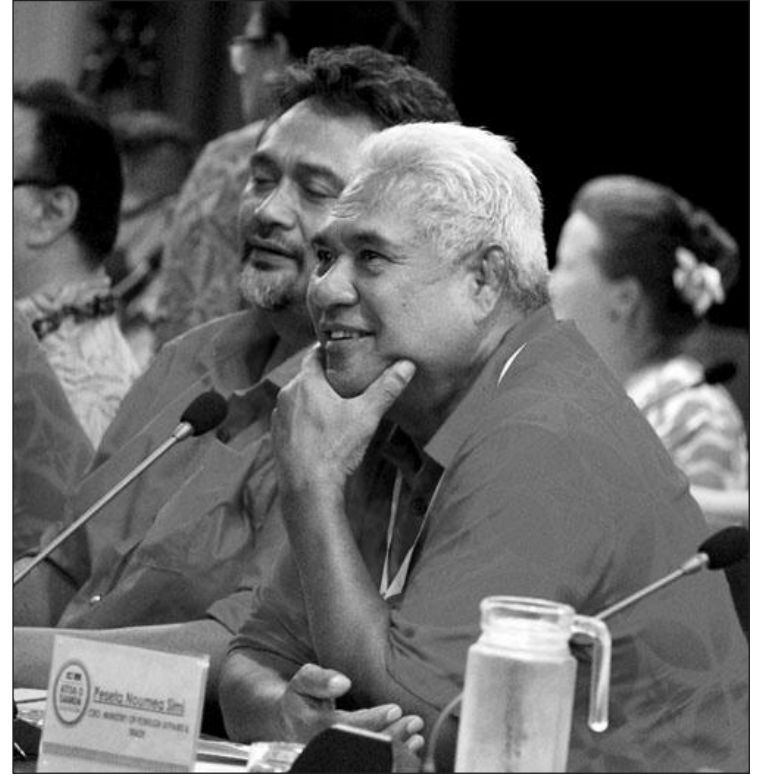

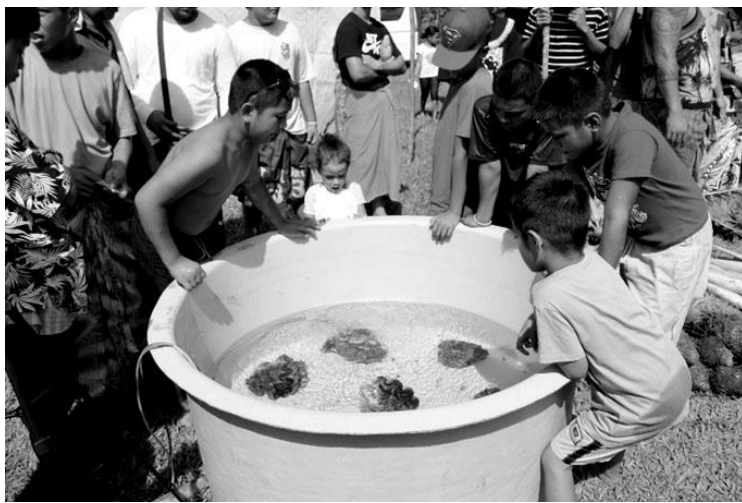
