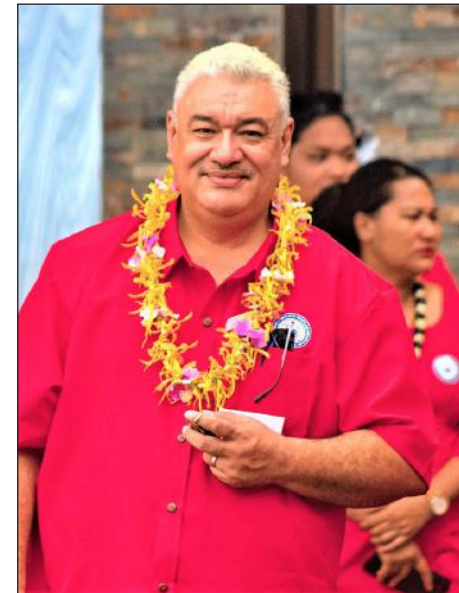

A first for the Pacific - Samoa Police invest in e-bicycles

Samoa's Police Services is the first in the Pacific to invest in electrical bicycles for their Patrol Unit, thanks to the Australian Government and their Federal Police through the Samoa Australia Partnership.

The 8 new electric bikes were handed over during the closing of the Bicycle Patrol Officer Program training at the Samoa Police Prisons and Correction Services training unit at Matautu on Wednesday afternoon.

Detective Superintendent Daniel Evans, the Senior Responsible Officer of the Samoa Australia Police Partnership in his remarks acknowledged that this is the first time that Samoa has been presented with e-bicycles.

And complimented the Samoa Police landmark achievement as the first in the region to invest in this new technology.

He noted that extensive research was carried out all over the world to ensure that the suitable bicycles were purchased for use for the Samoa

Re-elected M.P.'s sworn into Parliament

The three former Members of Parliament who resigned from their party last year prompting a by-election last month, and walking away with landslide wins landing them their re-elections have been sworn into Parliament this week.

Members of Parliament, 'Ale Vena Ale (Faleata No. 4), Tuu'u Anasi'i Leota (Siumu) and Mau'u Siasoi Puepuemai (Va'a o Fonoti), contested their former seats under the Fa'atuatua i le Atua Samoa ua Tasi (F.A.S.T.) party banner.

When they resigned from the party, the Speaker of the house had informed them they were to vacate their seats as is the law.

The constitutional requirement and electoral laws say that should an elected representative resign from a political party their seat straight away becomes vacant.

But, they refused and the result the speaker took the matter to the Supreme Court for a decision.

Police Officers graduate from B.P.O.P.

Twenty officers of the Samoa Police, Prisons and Corrections Services (S.P.P.C.S) have graduated from a two week training equipping them with necessary skills and knowledge to successfully execute their duties as bicycle patrol.

The trainees were taught techniques, and strategies through theoretical and practical exercises of bicycle patrol operations over the weeks the training was rolled out.

The Bicycle Patrol Officers Program (B.P.O.P) is conducted by the Australian Federal Police (A.F.P.) and includes a trainers training model where 3 officers from the program have graduated as trainers and will be able to execute the program locally in the future.

Detective Superintendent Daniel Evans, the Senior Responsible Officer of the Samoa Australia Police Partnership says although this is not the first time this training has been carried out, it is the first time that it has been executed with a trainer trainee model.

He thanked the Samoa Police for always putting their trust in the Australian Federal Police (A.F.P.).

But, says the bicycle patrol are always seen on the roads, see them working diligently every day to keep Samoa safe, which is an amazing thing.

He acknowledged the trainers from the A.F.P. Leading Senior Constable Clint Gordon and Leading Senior Constable Allan Young for making their life easy and bringing their expertise and knowledge here to Samoa.

The training is part of the Samoa Police and the Australian Federal Police Partnership to build-up skills and capability for the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (C.H.O.G.M.) Samoa is hosting next year says Detective Superintendent Evans.

He further announced the A.F.P.'s under the Samoa Australian Police Partnership adding funds to replace the uniforms ensuring it is up to standard it is recognised by, and that bicycles gifted last year maintains its high standard, as well as purchase safety equipment so the riders representing Samoa are safe demonstration to public.

Samoa's Police Commissioner, Auapaau Logoitino Filipo told that the event is a history in the making for the ministry, not only to witness the closing of the Bicycle Patrol Officers Program training but the handover of 8 recon power bike interceptor e-bicycles.

These bicycles he said have a speed of 45km per hour and is equipped with police lights and service bags.

He said is not the first valuable donation gifted by the Australian Government through the

They have also aided in the Samoa Police's capacity building of officers to be there at the level they should be to improve the standard of services delivery.

The bicycles will assist the ministry well as it coincides with preparations for the C.H.O.G.M. next year as well as improving standard of service delivery on a daily basis.

He urged the graduates to utilise their new found skills and knowledge for the proper use and maintenance of these expensive assets as well as looking out for them like their own.

Let this also serve as a reminder to the officers in the service to use these assets wisely for the long run especially for the benefit of the community.

On behalf of the Government of Samoa and the Minister of Police his Honourable Faualo Harry Schuster, and executive and the ministry as a whole Auapaau extended their gratitude and appreciation to the Government of Australia and its people through the Samoa Australian Police Partnership for the valuable contribution to the development of the Samoa Police.

S.D.A. Health Summit opens in Apia

Two-hundred members of the Seventh-Day Adventist Church from around the Pacific are currently in Samoa for their annual Health Summit.

But this gathering according to Health Director of the Summit, Afamasaga Ben Tofilau was initiated following concerns raised by Samoa's Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa during, a recent visit by the S.D.A. South Pacific Division President Glen Townend.

Her concerns according to the Health Director revealed that the numbers of Samoans estimated to die from Non-Communicable Diseases had skyrocketed to 81 %.

Compared to other countries in the region like Fiji, and the Solomon Islands that stood at the 60's and 70's mark.

The summit is being executed under the theme "Step Up to Wholeness" with the purpose of addressing critical health issues relating N.C.D.'s and the preventative measures available or that could be carried out for early detection intervention.

According to Afamasaga this helps to ensure that numbers of lives affected and lost due N.C.D.'s are reduced significantly.



"The summit encourages people in the Pacific and Samoa to promote healthy living to help reduce N.C.D.'s in various countries," added the Health Director of the Summit.

Associate Health Director of the S.D.A. Church Gad Koito told the media in a recent press conference that N.C.D.'s are no longer a problem but a crisis.

In fact this is why everyone at all levels of the community should join hands with the

Government to ensure that the disease is controlled and reduced.

He says this is the only way to ensure that the threat is taken care off.

Also attending the three-day conference are also Pastors and their wives from the church, members of the community, as well as representatives from over 60 individual S.D.A. churches around Samoa.

The meeting will officially open tomorrow

The summit will include healthy cooking, screening for high blood pressure and diabetes, and the launch of a cook book for \$50 tala.

Local doctors have also been invited to speak at the event from the Ministry of Health (M.O.H.).

Re-elected M.P.'s sworn into Parliament

That decision was made in a Judicial Settlement Conference before Justice Leiātaualesā Daryl Clarke to vacate their seats as Members of Parliament (M.P.) for Va'a o Fonotī, Faleata No.4 and Siumu and return to a by election.

That decision was finalised earlier this year when the three consented to vacate their seats and head into a by – election.

Mau'u, 'Ale, and Tuu'u all left H.R.P.P. citing they were unhappy with many leadership decisions of the party for a very long time and they had to do what would benefit their

constituencies.

Their swearing in means that their party now has 35 members accounting for two-thirds of Parliament, with the opposition numbers fixed at 18 members.

Meanwhile suspended H.R.P.P. members, Tuilaepa Sailele Malielegaoi and party Secretary Lealailepule Rimoni Aiafi have been reinstated into Parliament following a recent court decision.

Both Tuilaepa and Lealailepule are overseas and did not

attend the first sitting in the Legislative Assembly following that court decision.

That court decision in July this year voided the two-year suspension from the House of Tuilaepa and Lealailepule.

The Speaker of the House, Papali'i Lio Masipau has appealed this court decision and the matter will be heard in court next month. But, despite the appeal the recently re-instated M.P.'s resuming their parliamentary duties will not be affected in any way.

Samoa remains committed to the U.N. mandate: Fiame

As the world celebrates 78 years since the establishment of the United Nations, the Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa reaffirms Samoa's stance of its support of the United Nations.

In her keynote address at the One U.N. House at Tuanaimato on U.N. Day, Fiame spoke about the realisation that international cooperation is essential for a just, more sustainable, and peaceful future for our people and the planet.

Adding that Samoa has come a long way since joining the United Nations in 1976.

"Despite being a small island developing country, Samoa hopes to continue its call for global solidarity and unity to address the pressing global challenges that we currently face."

These challenges she spoke about include the threats of the climate crisis; the accelerating loss of biodiversity; threats to human rights; worsening conflicts; misuse of information and new technologies; and garnering the political will to strengthen a collective action towards

sustainable development by U.N. Member countries.

"At the national level, my government will continue to safeguard the rights of all its citizens and especially those who are most at risk of being left behind, including by strengthening social protection measures and prioritising assistance for those in need," said the Prime Minister.

Adding that Samoa focusing on people-centered development is pivotal to the implementation of its agenda over the next five years.

"As we celebrate the 75th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights this year, the government of Samoa pledges to strengthen laws, policies and institutions to ensure that all individuals can enjoy their economic, social, cultural, civil, and political rights without discrimination," she says.

"Have a happy U.N. Day!"

When Samoa joined the United Nations in the late 70s she became its 147th member.

"The A.F.P. and the Australian Government recognise that climate change affects the Pacific more than any other area on earth and we've seen the UN development project partner with E.P.C. to explore using electric vehicles and vessels to transform transportation in Samoa."

As a result said Detective Superintendent Evans, "We want to join that cause and work with the Samoa Police."

"And these e-bikes are the first step, and we hope they provide an avenue to patrol villages where there aren't roads, villages that are too far to walk and, to enhance the ability to engage with community in Samoa."

Law Enforcement Instructor of RECON a company based in Indiana in the United States, Caeser Dejesus will deliver the training

over two days to ensure that the officers fully understand how to handle these bikes.

Samoa's Police Commissioner Auapaau Logoitino Filipino said this is the first time in the history of the Samoa Police that e-bikes will now be used in the work of the ministry.

Acknowledging that the names of those who have graduated from the training will be recorded by the Samoa Police as the first ever that will use these bicycles.

He said the main idea is to strengthen the visibility of the Samoa Police not only in Apia but also in the rural communities so that there is more engagement with the community.

As a result the next plans will include distributing the bikes to rural out posts of the Samoa Police to ensure this happens.

According to Auapaau this is also part of

the Samoa Police's preparations leading up to the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) hosted in Samoa next year.

The commissioner strongly urged all those that will be using the bicycles to take good care of them and to ensure their maintenance when required especially since the cost of these transport vessels are very expensive.

Auapaau extended his thanks to the Australian Federal Police, the Government of Australia and to Detective Superintendent Daniel Evans of the Samoa Australia Police Partnership for the continuous support for the development of the Samoa Police Services and Samoa.

The total cost of the 8 bicycles is \$150,000.

More test matches needed: Toa Samoa Coach

Toa Samoa’s Head Coach Ben Gardiner says the team needs more test matches to build experience.

According to Gardiner this is the best way the boys can hold the fort against teams like New Zealand and Australia.

His thoughts were revealed at a Press Conference following the Toa Samoa vs Kiwi match at Eden Park last week Saturday.

“We need test matches,” Gardiner says claiming that whatever the National Rugby League decide to do that is what they will do.

However, pointed out that, “from our point of view we want to play test matches.”

With the Pacific Championships, Gardiner says they have had an opportunity for a number of the guys in their team to play two test matches now.

“We need more of those so that we can build up that experience so when we go against a

side like Australia or New Zealand who have guys that have 15 or 20 test matches under their belt, that’s how we start to be able to compete with those teams,” he says.

He commended the support of the Samoan people for the team all week leading up to the match.

When asked of the possibility of a home game World Cup match for the team, Gardiner says that something like this will mean everything to the Samoan people.

“Imagine taking that game to Samoa and the support that will be there back in Samoa,” he says.

“We’ve had a lot of support all week from different people in different places, all over the world, not just in the Auckland community but, from the communities back in Samoa and from other places all over the world.”

The Toa Samoa lost against the Kiwis 50 – 0 just a week after their 38 – 12 loss to the Kangaroos.



PRESENTATION OF CREDENTIALS OF THE AMBASSADOR EXTRAORDINARY AND PLENIPOTENTIARY OF ROMANIA TO SAMOA WEDNESDAY 25 OCTOBER, 2023

His Excellency Radu Gabriel Safta presented his Letter of Credence to the Member of the Council of Deputies, Afioga Le Mamea Tuiletufuga Ropati Mualia at a presentation of credential ceremony held this morning at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade, accrediting him as the Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Romania to Samoa with residence in Canberra.

Samoa and Romania have enjoyed cordial relations since the establishment of diplomatic relations in March 2006. Samoa continues to benefit from the assistance through the European Union Development Fund supporting regional development assistance programs channelled through the Pacific Islands Forum. Our two countries have worked collaboratively at the United Nations to advance our common goals for the prosperity of our countries and peoples. H.E Safta reiterated the importance of utilising the available avenues for enhancing cooperation such as our membership in the Pacific Island Forum where the EU is a dialogue partner and at the ACP-EU partnership and the

up-coming Samoa Agreement signing in Apia next month. Afioga Le Mamea expressed his confidence in the appointment of HE Safta as Ambassador of Romania to Samoa which will further strengthen our bilateral relations.

HE Radu Gabriel Safta is a career diplomat who held various senior positions at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Romania. HE Safta held diplomatic rankings of First Secretary, Counsellor, Minister-Counsellor and Minister Plenipotentiary in various Romanian missions. He was Consul General of Romania in Toronto, Canada as well as in Istanbul, Turkey. He was Romania's Representative to the Black Sea Economic Cooperation Organisation. He was also posted as Ambassador of Romania in Pretoria, South Africa and a non-resident Ambassador to Namibia, Botswana, Mozambique and Lesotho. HE Safta is currently the Ambassador of Romania to Australia with cross accreditation to Samoa. HE Safta holds a PhD in International Relations and European Studies from the Babeş Bolyai University in Romania.

Pacific Scholars meet in Apia

Close to 60 scholars from around the Pacific are in Apia for initial discussions whether an Academy for Sciences and Humanities should be set up in the region.

Vice Chancellor of the National University of Samoa (N.U.S.) Tuifuisa'a Dr. Patila Malua Aмоса told the Savali these participants are Pacific scholars mainly from the Science areas around the region.

The two day conference she says is funded by the Sasakawa Peace Foundation and initiated by the International Science Council (I.S.C.).

"The purpose of this conference is to discuss setting up a Pacific Academy of Sciences and Humanities."

According to Tuifuisa'a this is the first meeting of its kind and the initial forum to discuss and share ideas whether an academy should be set up in the Pacific of this nature.

This would be the first academy for the Pacific region if discussions fall towards a majority backing this idea.

"If everyone around the region supports it, then we will discuss where it should be located. And if discussions lead to all agreeing in a consensus of the country where the academy will be set up, then we will talk about what needs to be in place to guide the work, initiatives and purpose of the academy."

According to Tuifuisa'a the International Science Council is an international organisation and under its umbrella are regional academies like in the Caribbean, Africa and Asia but nothing yet in the Pacific.

"However, there are so many Pacific people that have gained qualifications and conducted research in various areas of sciences and humanities in the region and so there is a need for a centre to coordinate all these researches of the Pacific," says the Vice Chancellor.

If it goes ahead she says, it will likely be an academy established by the Pacific people or run by the Pacific people and will be a much needed coordination body to coordinate all researches of the region.

"Because we understand that for policy development of any country to happen, you don't just come out with a policy, there should be data as evidence to support the development of the policy, or development of initiatives for sustainable development of different countries," he says.

"So, we would like to go with evidence data or evidence based development and these are evidence from findings from these researches in different areas."

According to Tuifuisa'a there are priority research areas in the region at the moment with the first being climate change and several impact of climate change, such as impact of agriculture and food security health and disease and education, social impacts of climate change.

"So researches by different researchers in the Pacific can be collected and shared through the academy, so it is really the promotion of Science, technology, engineering and mathematics (S.T.E.M.)."

Chief Executive Officer of the Ministry of Education and Culture, Aeau Chris Hazelman expressed his support of an academy of this sort to be established in the Pacific.

Calling it, "a hub for scholars to innovate and create shared solutions to global and regional challenges so we can think globally and act locally".

"Unlike most parts of the world, the Pacific region is the only region without a national or regional academy," he said.

"Therefore, this important meeting marks a significant milestone in establishing a regional academy in the pursuit of knowledge for a prosperous and thriving Pacific region."

He says looking around us we see a world facing numerous challenges; climate change, energy insecurity, water and food insecurity, environmental degradation, fragile and weak internal economies.

"Increasing geostrategic and global security challenges are some of the pressing issues that demand our attention. The Pacific region, with its unique geographical, economic and cultural diversity, is particularly vulnerable to these challenges."

According to Aeau the academy has long played a critical role in supporting scholarly activity for national development and curating knowledge and scientific evidence to advice governments and inform public policy affecting communities.

"However, the challenges we face today are not confined by national borders. They require international collaboration and networking among science and humanities experts who belong to academies in order to find sustainable solutions to these challenges."

A Pacific Academy of Sciences and Humanities will present a welcomed opportunity to address these challenges faced by the

Pacific region by providing a platform for scholars to collaborate, share knowledge, and address the unique challenges that we, as a region face he added.

But it doesn't end there says Aeau. If established it will aid in capacity building for the region with focus and emphasis on support for young people with the career development in the Pacific for the Pacific by providing funding, mentorship, and building collegiality with peers regionally and globally.

"One of the key strengths of academies is their ability to bring together experts from various disciplines. By fostering interdisciplinary approaches to synthesising evidence, academies can provide comprehensive insights into complex problems."

He said, "This holistic perspective is crucial in addressing regional challenges in the Pacific effectively. Therefore, a Pacific Academy offers existing possibilities to connect scholars from across the globe who share a common goal, that is: addressing global challenges through science and actionable knowledge."

"The establishment of a Pacific Academy of Sciences and Humanities will be a global testament and a commitment by the Pacific region to promote sustainable developments through scholarly activities, providing interdisciplinary approaches to complex problems, offering scientific advice to governments as well as informing public policy for the benefit of communities, and fostering international collaboration among academies, so that we can create a better future for generations to come."

Before concluding Aeau expressed his gratitude to Sir Peter Glukman, Sir Colin Tukuitonga, the International Science Council, and the Sasakawa Peace Foundation for this initiative of establishment of a Pacific Academy of Sciences and Humanities and for bringing the region together to discuss, debate and shape an academy that will benefit the Pacific.

"Thank you for your generosity of spirit, vision and support."

SAMOA CELEBRATES UN DAY

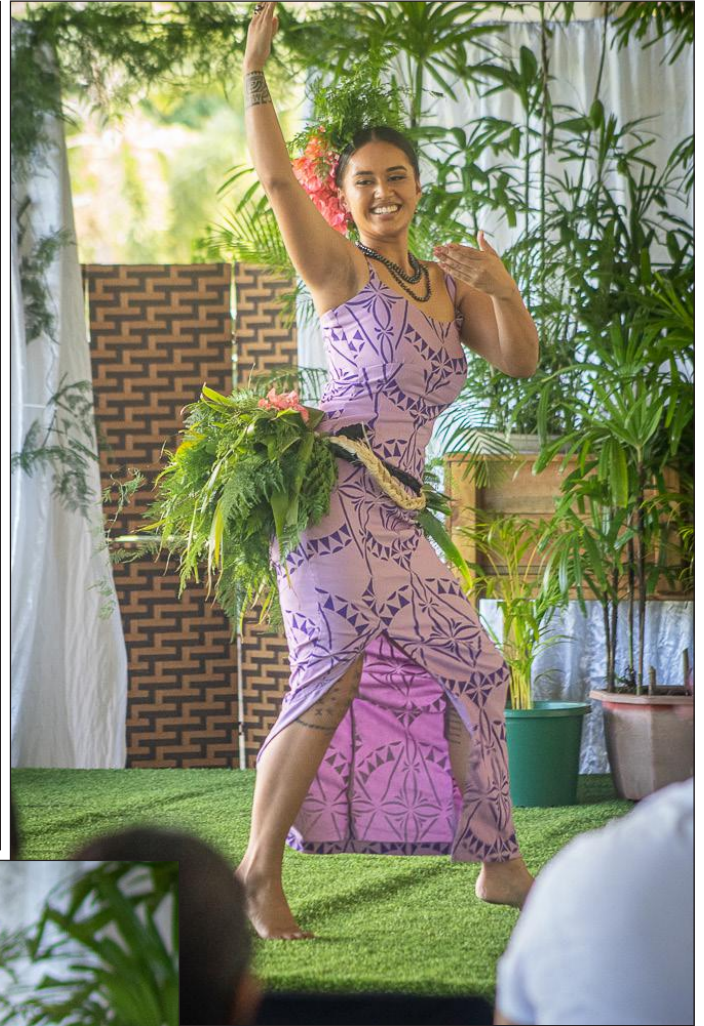
The United Nations Country Team in Samoa commemorated 78 years since the establishment of the United Nations in 1945.
